Aiken Resident Honored by Secretary of Energy for Work at National Lab

The National Energy Technology Laboratory is proud to announce that Aiken resident Doug Wyatt has received a Department of Energy Secretary Achievement Award for his part in responding to the Deepwater Horizon oil spill that occurred in the Gulf of Mexico in 2010.

Wyatt and other researchers formed a team that estimated the rate and amount of oil flowing into the Gulf so engineers could design options for

capping the well. Each team member received an award from Energy Secretary Steven Chu. It is the highest nonmonetary award a DOE team can receive from the Department.

Wyatt supports the Office of Research and Development at NETL as Research Manager for Geological and Environmental Sciences for URS Corporation. He is also a research professor and lecturer at USC-Aiken and an Aiken County Soil and Water Commissioner.
