SUBJECT: Army Civilian Employees Who Volunteer to Support Total Force Department of Defense (DoD) Civilian Requirements in Afghanistan

1. References:

a. Memorandum, Secretary of Defense, 19 September 2011, subject: DoD Support to Civilians Capacity Requirements in Afghanistan (Enclosure 2).

b. Memorandum, Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Army (Manpower and Reserve Affairs), 17 November 2011, subject: DoD Support to Civilians Capacity Requirements in Afghanistan (Enclosure 3).

2. The Department of the Army (DA) supports and endorses the DoD guidance set forth in the referenced memorandum. Army leaders at all levels are asked to fully support civilians accepted for Total Force assignments, and to support them and their families during their deployments. This memorandum provides new guidance to Army Commands to place a high priority on filling Civilian requirements in Afghanistan. Army Commands must work with the Under Secretary of Defense (Personnel and Readiness) (USD (P&R), Civilian Expeditionary Workforce (CEW) Program Officer to identify and approve civilian employees for deployment to Afghanistan.

3. The DoD is approaching a critical time in its efforts in Afghanistan and civilians will continue to play a key role in supporting their strategy. The CEW Program Office has been tasked with getting over 400 Civilians boots-on-ground in Afghanistan by the end of January 2012. Civilians who are currently deployed in Iraq, who are ready to be released from their deployment due to the Iraq drawdown plans, are being contacted and offered new 12-month tours in similar positions in Afghanistan. Some Army Commands have seen urgent requests to approve these reassignments and there will be more. These Civilians will not meet the total need and we expect the pace in this effort will pick up.

4. For now, Army Commands are asked to clear up all outstanding endorsements and pending denials. The CEW Program Office expects that individuals selected for deployments or reassignment to Joint Taskforce assignments in Afghanistan will be cleared, unless the CEW Program Office is notified otherwise by the Army Command within five days of the initial notification.

5. A list of outstanding requests for management endorsement for Army Civilians selected for Total Force mission deployment is enclosed (enclosure not sent to all addresses) (Enclosure 1). The list at Enclosure 1 is sent to only those Army organizations that have outstanding endorsement beyond the CEW Program Office suspense. These Army Commands are asked to provide an immediate response through the Civilian Human Resources Agency (CHRA) Deployment Coordinator to the CEW Program Office. Please verify this list matches your records of outstanding requests.

6. Commands are expected to exercise due diligence in identifying Army civilians who are unsuitable for deployment, not qualified for the assignment, or whose deployment will be a significant negative impact on the losing organization. An organization that intends to deny an Army Civilian the opportunity for deployment or reassignment to Afghanistan must notify CHRA Deployment Coordinator of their intent to submit a denial and the reason within five days of the initial notification of the Army Civilian's selection. Formal denials should be submitted within 10 days, through command channels endorsed by the Commander or his/her designee, i.e., General Officer/Senior Executive Service level, through the Army Assistant G-1 for Civilian Personnel, to the Deputy Under Secretary of Defense (Civilian Personnel Policy).
