1 ○ **GREAT BASIN SMOKEJUMPER BASES.**

- 2
- 3 • **MCCALL SMOKEJUMPER BASE (USFS).** Normally staffed with 70 smokejumpers.
 4 Dispatch centers that can order direct are the Boise Dispatch Center, Central Idaho
 5 Interagency Fire Center, South Central Idaho Interagency Dispatch Center, Nez-Perce
 6 National Forest and the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest.

7

8 In order to maintain the flexibility of responding to several concurrent requests, the standard
 9 DC-3 load will remain at 12 jumpers. However, the aircraft will be equipped with standard
 10 cargo for 16 smokejumpers, plus a Hale Fry pump with 1,000 feet of hose.

11

12 If the need exists for more than 12 jumpers, e.g., multiple fires requiring 4-6 jumpers each, or
 13 an emerging fire that could require 14-16 jumpers, a special request for this larger load can
 14 be made with no delays in the departure time.

15

16 A full 20-person smokejumper crew can be delivered to an incident where a Type 1 Crew is
 17 needed. The 20-person crew request should be used in situations where all 20 jumpers
 18 would be dropped in the same location. This 20-person crew is equipped to be self-sufficient
 19 for 2 days. No pump or hose is included with this load. Concurrence of the National
 20 Interagency Coordination Center must be obtained prior to use of smokejumpers as a Type 1
 21 Crew. See National Interagency Mobilization Guide.

- 23 • **BOISE SMOKEJUMPER BASE (BLM).** Normally staffed with 81 smokejumpers. The
 24 primary mission of the BLM Boise Smokejumpers is to provide professional, effective, and
 25 safe fire suppression and fuels reduction services to BLM and interagency land managers.

26

27 Nevada, Utah, Idaho and Colorado have a contingent of twelve (12) smokejumpers available
 28 to them after they have been activated.

29

30 The De Havilland DHC-6 Twin Otter will be the primary aircraft utilized by the Boise
 31 smokejumpers. The normal configuration for this aircraft is eight (8) smokejumpers with gear
 32 plus one (1) pilot and one (1) smokejumper spotter, both of whom stay with the aircraft.

33

34 Other aircraft used, BLM Alaska or USFS, will be pre-positioned to maximize mission
 35 effectiveness.

36

37 Additional smokejumpers or aircraft ordered to supplement base operations in Boise will be
 38 coordinated by the WGBCC.

39

40 Utilization of BLM Boise smokejumpers will be overseen by the BLM Fire Operations Group
 41 Manager.

3 • **CURRENT-YEAR ROTATION.**

4
5 All teams will adhere to the two-week rotation period. Teams are mobilized on a first, second
6 and third team out basis. Once a team is mobilized or if a team is unavailable for dispatch,
7 the next team in order of rotation will assume their position until they are mobilized or the
8 rotation period ends. If a team is released to their home unit, has time left in the rotation
9 period and are available, they will enter the rotation in the last position.

10 If all three teams in rotation are mobilized, additional orders for Type 2 Incident Management
11 Teams will be placed with NICC. During periods of high fire activity, the Great Basin
12 Coordinating Group may approve early activation of Great Basin teams not in rotation. **For**
13 **early activation justification, see Supplement 1, H.6.**

14
15 Alternate methods of filling team positions, other than the Command and General Staff, can
16 be utilized and will be closely monitored. Positions may be shared by qualified people.
17 Positions may be assigned to a department or agency to fill that has a “pool” of qualified
18 people. It is critical that dispatch and coordination centers know the method being used, and
19 coordinate any changes.
