Dear Parents:

We at the Fort Bragg AWANA Program feel privileged to have your child attending our AWANA Club. AWANA stands for Approved Workmen Are Not Ashamed and is taken from 2 Timothy 2:15. Our AWANA Clubs are for boys and girls from 3 years of age (by Sept. 1) through the 12th grade. Awana is a Bible centered club built around Scripture memorization, Bible study and game time.

When your child first comes to one of our Clubs (Cubbies, Sparks, T&T), he or she will receive an Entrance Booklet for their particular club. This normally takes 2-3 weeks to complete. After they have completed this booklet, they then become a member of that particular club and they receive their handbook and uniform.

AWANA was created by and continues to be led by adult volunteers of the Fort Bragg Community. (Parents are required to volunteer at AWANA at least once during the program year. Background checks will be conducted on all volunteers) The Ft. Bragg religious education program has agreed to provide the materials for AWANA. If you are able to make a donation to help defray the cost for the books and uniforms that your child earns, we would greatly appreciate it.

We do not wish for any child to be excluded from our AWANA program for financial reasons. Therefore, the prices listed on the next page are a suggested donation. We will be accepting donations on the dates noted on the AWANA schedule on back of brochure.

SCRIPTURE EMPHASIS

The goal of Awana is to equip our community with the Gospel of Christ and train them to serve God. We emphasize the disciplines of evangelism and discipleship to our clubbers. Through this process of faith formation children have the opportunity to grow spiritually.

A clubber has the opportunity to learn Scripture verses throughout the program year by interacting with their Bible and Awana club handbook.

We encourage clubbers to recite by memory at least one to two Scripture verses per week to their leaders at Awana. (Children may also recite verses to Awana leaders during Chapel services.) It is helpful for parents to encourage and help their child to memorize these Scriptures during the week so that they will come to Club and/or Chapel prepared to recite them.

AWANA GENERAL GUIDELINES

- Be on time. Arrive between 5:15 and 5:30 PM for check-in. All clubs will start promptly at 5:30 PM and end at 7:15 PM.
- Parents MUST accompany Cubbies into the Cubbies' Room and hand them off to Cubbie Leaders.
 Parents can pick-up their Cubbie in the same room.
- 3. Bring your Handbook and Bible each week (Cubbies do not need to bring their Bible).
- Wear the AWANA uniform to the club each week so that the clubber may be presented any awards they have earned.
- 5. Discipline: If a child continues to disrupt the club, his/her parents will be called to pick up the child.
- 6. All parents/guardians must come inside to pick -up children. No child will be allowed to leave the building without a parent/guardian.
