What is the purpose of CEF MCM?

We strive to establish them in the Word of God and in a local chapel or church for Christian living and to help meet the unique spiritual needs of military children who live with the reality of deployment.

How can I support this ministry?

- **Pray**—We want to reach the 7,000 to 8,000 children living on Ft. Bragg post.
- Volunteer—Help is needed with administrative paperwork and club activities for 90 minutes once a week.
- **Give**—*CEF MCM* is supported by monetary donations from churches and individual Christians who believe in spreading the Word of God to children.

What is CEF Military Children's Ministry?

Child Evangelism Fellowship[®], a nonprofit/non-denominational mission organization, started CEF Military Children's Ministry to meet the unique needs of children living on military posts. As the children face the deployment of a parent and constant change, CEF MCM will be there to offer stability and share Christ's love.

Primary Ministries

Good News Club

An exciting, fun-filled hour held once a week in Ft. Bragg schools, neighborhoods and community centers. Clubs include games, Bible lessons, the application of faith to daily life and the importance of connection to the faith community. *GNC* is for boys and girls ages 5-12.

Truth Chasers Club[™](formerly CEF Mailbox Club) A correspondence Bible course program that is a series of lessons for children to complete and mail back to *CEF* then receive another lesson in the mail.

5-Day Club

A week-long Bible program held during summer months for boys and girls 5-12 years old. Typically clubs meet in the parks and community centers in military housing areas. The club includes Bible lessons, creative learning activities, missions stories, songs and life-changing Scripture memory. One day a mom stopped me to say that her son came home from club and emphatically stated, "We need to go buy a Bible." When asked why, he answered, "Because the only way I will learn about God is if I can read God's words." *Anjanette Franklin* CEF MCM *Coordinator*

Who can attend club?

- Boys and girls ages 5 12.
- Children do not have to attend school where clubs are being offered. Home-schooled children are encouraged to come.

• Volunteers can bring their school-age children with them to club.

Who can volunteer?

- Christians over 12 years old who are concerned for the spiritual well-being of children.
- Volunteers receive specialized training and must complete background checks.
