**MISSION:** Hawthorne Army Depot receives, stores, re-warehouses, preserves and packages, monitors, renovates, demilitarizes and disposes conventional ammunition; issues conventional munitions; insures capability to ship/receive containerized munitions; operates calibration lab, maintains an International Standards Organization container maintenance/repair facility and maintains an ammunition maintenance capability. HWAD is the designated site for long-term storage of reused industrial plant equipment and will receive, store and be accountable for all industrial plant equipment.

## **CAPABILITIES:**

- Demilitarization
- Desert training for military units
- Ammunition renovation
- Quality assurance
- ISO container maintenance/repair
- Range scrap processing

**HISTORY:** The Naval Ammunition Depot Hawthorne was established in September 1930. It was redesignated Hawthorne Army Ammunition Plant in 1977 when it transferred to Army control as part of the Single Manager for Conventional Ammunition. In 1994, it ended its production mission and became Hawthorne Army Depot.

**STATISTICS:** In fiscal year 2007, HWAD had an operating budget of \$116,054 and a payroll of \$1.67 million. There are 32 Department of the Army civilians and one Soldier. Contractor statistics are considered proprietary and therefore, are not available.

**FACILITIES:** HWAD is housed on 147,236 acres. It has 491 buildings, 2,427 igloos and a storage capacity of 7,685,000 square feet.
