By relying on distinctively religious rhetoric, Former President Bush played into the Jihadists hand: that of conflating the war on terror with a war on Islam. President Obama has reversed such a stance by stating unequivocally that the US is not at war with Islam and by refraining from using the phrase "war on terror." But while changing the rhetoric is an important first step to repairing the mistrust many even pro-western Muslims feel toward the US, it does not go far enough. The US needs to address many of the issues that provide tinder for the Jihadists including ending the suffering of the Palestinians and the support for Arab dictators, while engaging the democratically elected Islamist leaders in Lebanon and Palestine.
