Dec. 8 Public Meeting Testimony

For the past four years, I've volunteered with good government groups to work on voting integrity. I've been particularly worried about DREs, with or without a paper trail, as it has been repeatedly demonstrated by

computer experts and by the startling anomalies during actual elections that these voting machines are not transparent or reliable. My principle recommendation for the EAC is to rid this country of DREs and replace them with a system of paper ballots marked by hand (or ballot marker for voters with disabilities who prefer to use them) and counted by optical scanners or by hand. If optical scanners are used, a mandatory audit (perhaps 20%) needs to be done in which hand counts would verify the accuracy of the scanners.

Chairwoman Rodriguez,

I am writing in response to you request for testimony on voting methodology preferences.

I would like to voice a strong preference for only systems where ballots are marked by hand on paper by voters, which at this time only optical scan systems meet this criteria. As we can see by the situation in Minnesota's Senatorial race, it is absolutely necessary to have paper ballots that allow for recounting by hand by human beings. As is also evidenced by the recount in Minnesota, there are plenty of places in the system where chain of custody issues can cause problems. As I read yesterday, in one city in Minnesota, 133 ballots are missing. In a race that could be determined by a handful of votes, this race is primary evidence of how important paper ballots are. Were this race to have been carried out on electronic machines, DRE's, there would be no way to conduct this level of scrutiny of the ballots.

My preference would be to literally throw away every touch screen voting machine in America, and stop letting our votes be counted by large corporations and return vote counting to the people. Elections in this country are too important to be controlled by a couple of companies with connections to one of the major parties in this country.
