From the Vice



Lodging System Upgrade

Lodging POC's,

In the upgrade to version 7 for the ALRS release provides members with a 9 Digit "USER ID" instead of using their "SSN" to schedule lodging arrangement for upcoming UTA's.

When members call in to schedule their lodging it will ask for their USER

ID. Once member enters SSN and PIN the system will inform them of the change and provide a 9 digit USER ID. When scheduling UTA lodging arrangement members will have to note down their new USER ID.

If members forget their USER ID's the lodging office at 910-394 -2216 (Bldg 306) can provide the USER ID's to the members.

Top 10 Reasons Evaluations are Returned from ARPC:

- 1. Signatures missing
- 2. PME bullets stating school name (ie SOS, ACSC)
- 3. Missing marks (concur, etc)

- 6. Section 1 missing "AMC" and "Non-EAD"
- 7. Referral evaluation not certified as "True Copy" by FSS
- 8. Signatures and dates not in chronological order
- 9. Dates do not match
- 10. Feedback date outside of eval period

Protocol Corner

December's Protocol Point of Reference

Continuing in the same vein of last month's focus on saluting, it is important to address other important Customs and Courtesies in the Air Force. Simran Khurana says, "Respect is a virtue of the noble. Great people climbed the ladder of success when they shed their ego and embraced humility. When you respect others, you respect yourself. Stand tall amongst your peers and mentors by giving them due respect."

8.2. Other Marks of Respect.

8.2.1. Juniors shall show deference to seniors at all times by recognizing their presence and by employing a courteous and respectful bearing and mode of speech toward them.

8.2.2. Juniors shall stand at attention (unless seated at mess or unless circumstances make such action impracticable or inappropriate) as follows:

8.2.2.1. When addressed by an officer senior to them.

8.2.2.2. When an officer of flag or general rank, the commanding officer, or an officer senior to the commanding officer, or an officer making an official inspection enters the room or space.

8.2.3. Juniors shall walk or ride to the left of seniors whom they are accompanying.

8.2.4. Officers shall enter aircraft and other modes of transportation in inverse order of rank and shall depart them in order of rank, unless there is special reason to the contrary. The seniors shall be accorded the more desirable seats.
