TAPS Mission Statement

TAPS is the national non-profit Veterans Service Organization made up of, and providing support to, everyone who has lost a loved one serving in the armed forces.







- 1994 TAPS founded with the support of SECDEF and SECVA, benchmarking the best peer based support programs in America.
- 1997 TAPS is recognized as a Veterans Service Organization and the Chairman, JCS Shalikashvili directs the Services to connect all surviving families with TAPS.
- 2001 TAPS is the only private organization in the Pentagon Family Assistance Center beside the Red Cross.
- 2008 TAPS reaches 25,000 military survivors in its care.
- 2009 Chairman, JCS Mullen calls TAPS the "Gold Standard" in care for the surviving military family.



TAPS Mission

- The mission of TAPS is to honor our men and women who have made the ultimate sacrifice in service to America by *caring for all those who they loved and left behind.*
- TAPS carries on and expands upon the immediate support provided by the Casualty Officer in the first few days by giving survivors a comprehensive array of support services, available 24/7, at no cost to the survivor or to the government.



Meeting the Mission

- Four core services:
 - Peer based <u>emotional support</u> for ALL who are grieving the death of a soldier.
 - <u>Case work assistance</u>, including legal assistance, financial resources, and benefits.
 - <u>Community based grief support</u>, including unlimited free clinical counseling, grief and trauma resources and information, support groups.
 - <u>Crisis intervention</u>, 24/7/365 with leading responders in every community in America.






