IT'S A FAMILY AFFAIR

Thinking About Drinking and Drug Use Systemically

Vicious Spiral

Denial, Poor Problem Solving, Cognitive Distortions, "Checking Out"

Substance Use

Family Problems

Nagging, Fighting,
"4 O'Clock Happy Hour"
Inadvertent Reinforcement of Use

SUBSTANCE USE AND FAMILIES: STAGES OF CORROSION

- Exacerbation of Other Problems
 - Denial
 - Poor Problem-Solving
 - Low Levels of Commitment, Caring,
 Communication Skills, Conflict Resolution
- Becomes a Problem In Its Own Right
- Becomes "The Problem"




BEHAVIORAL COUPLES THERAPY (BCT) FOR ALCOHOLISM & DRUG ABUSE

The Family-Involved Approach with the Greatest Empirical Support

BCT: PURPOSE & COMPONENTS

- Purpose: Increase Relationship Factors Conducive to Abstinence
- Five Primary Elements:
 - Recovery Contract with Partner
 - Relationship Enhancement Exercises
 - Communication Skills Training
 - Conflict Resolution ("No Angry Touching")
 - Continuing Recovery Plan
- Typically Provided Along with Individual Tx






VIOLENCE

The "BIG" Family Secret

INTIMATE PARTNER VIOLENCE (IPV) & SUBSTANCE ABUSE

- 60% of Substance-Abusing Couples Report Male-to-Female Violence
- 5-11 Times Higher on Days of Use
- Treatment Very Politically Charged
 - Standard Treatments Largely Ineffective
 - Couple Treatment Highly Controversial

INTIMATE PARTNER VIOLENCE PREVALENCE OUTCOMES



SUMMARY

- Compared to Standard Treatment, Partner-Involved Approaches Result in:
 - Lower Levels of Drinking, Drug Use, and Other Related Behaviors
 - Higher Relationship Satisfaction
 - Lower Levels of Partner/Family Violence
 - Improved Children Adjustment
 - Better Emotional Adjustment for Family Members

BCT IS ARGUABLY THE MOST EFFICACIOUS TREATMENT FOR SUBSTANCE ABUSE

APPLICATIONS TO MILITARY FAMILIES

- BCT's Roots Are Planted in the VA
- Presenting Problems Seen in Military Families:
 - Drinking/Drug Use
 - Intimate Partner Violence
 - Children's Adjustment
 - Partner Psychological Distress
- BCT Addresses These Issues
