August

Water-lilies, hibiscus, crapemyrtles, conifers, boxwood, herbs, annuals, sweet pepperbush, pepper collection, meadow and prairie wildflowers, cardinal-flower, plum-leaf azalea, hostas, hydrangeas

September

Firethorn in fruit, hibiscus, viburnums in fruit, autumn crocuses, boxwood, crapemyrtles, herbs, annuals, holly osmanthus, pepper collection, hostas

Late September into early October

Meadow flowers, herbs, annuals

October

Fall foliage, firethorn in fruit, hibiscus, autumn crocuses, water-lilies, crapemyrtles, viburnums in fruit, conifer foliage and cones, dogwoods in fruit, boxwood, herbs, annuals, ornamental grasses, native witch-hazels, fall-blooming camellias, toad-lilies, chrysanthemums

November

Conifer foliage and cones, dogwoods in fruit, viburnums in fruit, ornamental grasses, fall foliage, fall-blooming camellias, chrysanthemums, native witch-hazels

December

Hollies in fruit, heavenly-bamboo in fruit, conifer foliage and cones, Japanese apricot, wintersweet (in mild weather)
