# 6<sup>th</sup> SOS APPLICATION PROCEDURES

# (ENLISTED)

1. GENERAL. Duty with the 6th Special Operations Squadron (6 SOS) is a unique opportunity. Dramatic political and military changes in the world since 1989 have made insurgency, narcotics trafficking, subversion, and terrorism in developing countries the most immediate threat to U.S. national security and foreign policy interests. We envision airpower as a viable instrument in assisting foreign military forces to combat internal threats and conduct nation-building activities. The 6 SOS is taking the lead in developing a combat aviation advisory capability in Air Force Special Operations Command (AFSOC) and United States Special Operations Command (USSOCOM), and we require advisors with demonstrated performance, relevant expertise, intellectual acumen, and dedication to personal and professional excellence.

2. APPLICATION PACKAGE. An application package is mandatory; it will serve as a discriminator when evaluating applicants with similar qualifications. Please prepare the package with the tabbed items listed below. They will provide us with a clear picture of your qualifications and potential. Please include your contact number (DSN and Comm) and email. The tabbed package must include:

TAB 1. A one-page narrative, in official memorandum format, stating why you want to join the 6 SOS, and why you are uniquely qualified for the job. Include life and work experiences, education, and any other information relevant to the combat aviation advisory mission.

TAB 2. A military resume supporting the narrative in TAB 1. (See/use TAB 2 resume example for format)

TAB 3. A copy of last 5 EPRs. Most recent on top in reverse chronological order.

TAB 4. Three professional references. One must be from your current, immediate supervisor and one from your squadron commander or equivalent. Include both phone number and email information for contact. Full letters of recommendation are not required.

TAB 5. If foreign-language qualified, provide Defense Language Proficiency Test (DLPT) scores in listening and reading. If DLPT scores are unavailable but you are fluent in a language (i.e., native speaker), provide an explanation why you have no scores. If you have no DLPT scores or are not fluency validated by some other means, provide the converted score for the Defense Language Aptitude Battery (DLAB). Contact your base education office for DLAB and DLPT testing. However, do not let the lack of a DLAB score delay submission of an application. Applications will be considered without the score, on a case by case basis (unable to test, OPSTEMPO, etc). In these cases the DLAB will be administered upon arrival to Hurlburt.

TAB 6. A single page SURF. From AFPC website select AMS or use the hyperlink <u>https://afas.afpc.randolph.af.mil/AMSNET/default.aspx</u> and then select AMS then select Personnel Information and then My Career Brief and then save, print and scan into email document.

TAB 7. If you are rated, provide a copy of your AF Form 942, *Record of Evaluation*, copies of your AF Forms 8, *Certificate of Aircrew Qualification*, and a copy of your Flying History Report. AF Form 942 on top then AF Form 8 and then FHR, all with most recent on top in reverse chronological order.

TAB 8. Your official Physical Fitness Report from the Air Force Portal. It is preferred that the most recent PFT have been accomplished within 60 days of application submittal.

TAB 9. Official 5 x 7 Air Force photograph

NOTE: Application Packages will only be accepted electronically, and only complete applications will be considered. Due to the size of the .pdf documents it is advised to scan the tabs separately and send individual emails for each tab. Email the completed package to <u>afsotc.ras@hurlburt.af.mil</u>. In the subject line put your rank, last name and specialty, ie. Capt Jones – C-130 IP.

3. Upon receipt of all completed applications, we will determine the best-qualified individuals for the position, and they will be invited to attend an assessment week at Hurlburt Field. Upon successful completion of assessment week, the commander will formally offer positions with the squadron. All applicants will be notified of their status at the end of assessment week. If you are selected, we will follow up with more detailed information on AFPC involvement, PCS orders, school dates (if applicable), reporting date, etc.
