How does BOSS work?

Installations establish a formal BOSS program to include a BOSS council consisting of single soldier representatives from Garrison tenant units. Typically the installation (CSM) Command Sergeant Major serves as the senior military advisor to the council. The installation FMWR BOSS advisor is appointed to provide guidance in planning soldier activities, financial accountability, community support, marketing programs, and assist soldiers to improve quality of life issues.

Who can participate in BOSS?

Events are targeted to support single soldier activities. However some installations also include single parents and unaccompanied soldiers to support their community. The intent of the BOSS program is to support single soldier activities and promote soldier moral. BOSS events are open to all authorized FMWR users.
