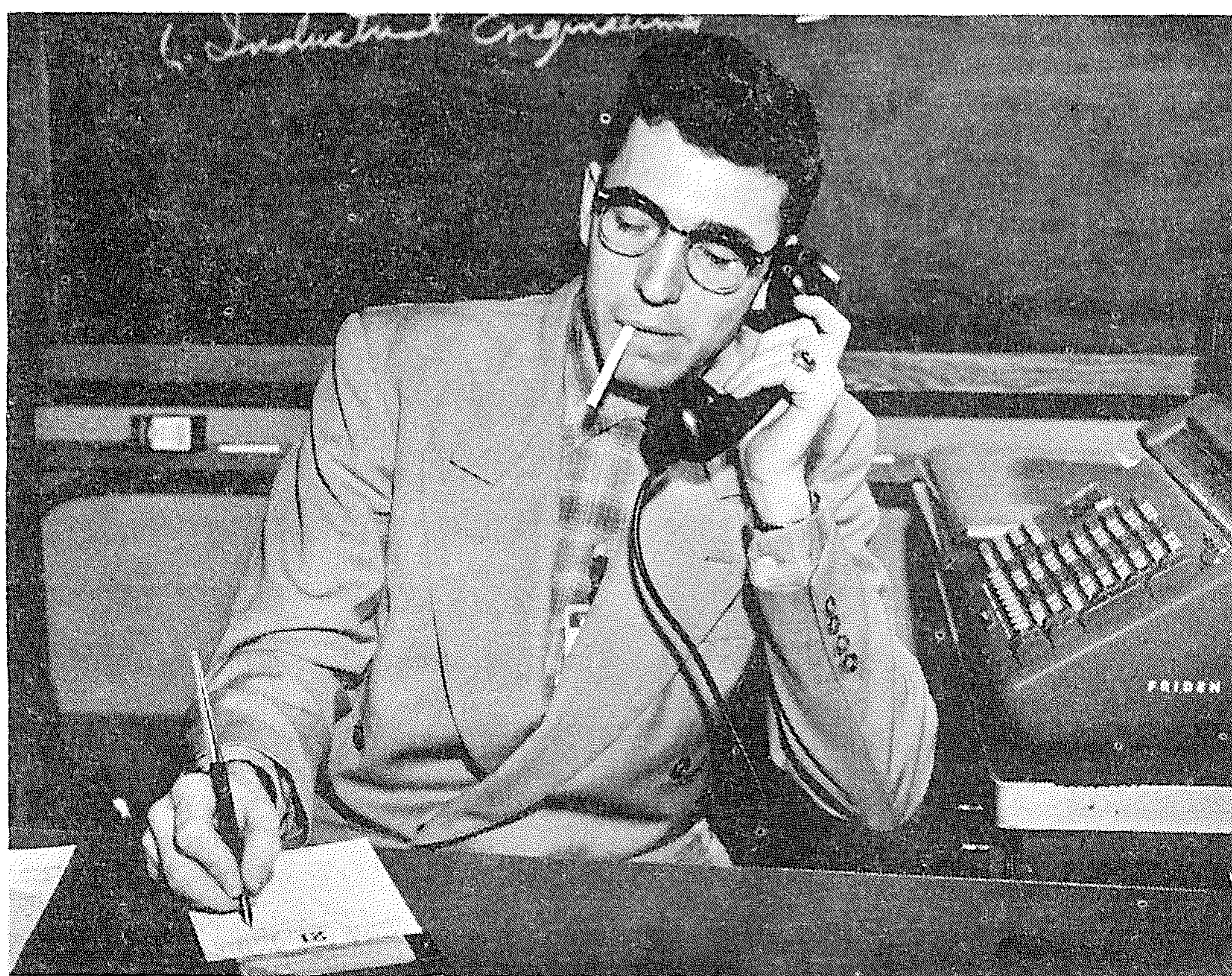


"TELE-TALK"..By..

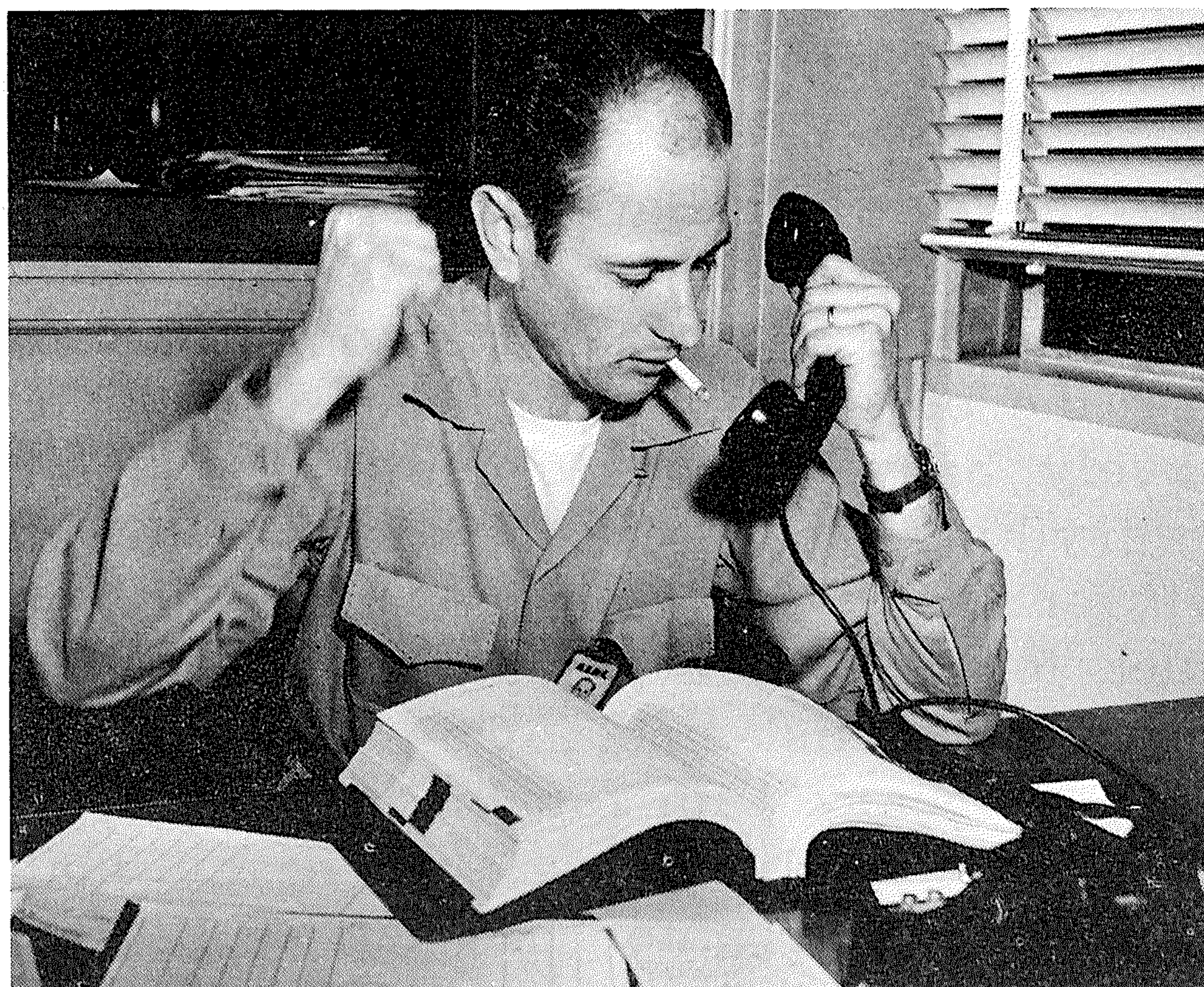
