Description: PERSONALIZED COMMENTS SHOULD BE ACKNOWLEDGED; HOWEVER MASS PRODUCED AND ROUTINE COMMENTS NEED NOT BE ACKNOWLEDGED.

- 1. The purpose of this guidance is to explain a change in the final regulations regarding the requirement to acknowledge public notice comments.
- 2. In the final regulations, the second sentence of 33 CFR 325.2(a)(3) was changed from: "Receipt of the comments will be acknowledged and they will be made a part of the administrative record of the application" to: "Receipt of the comments will be acknowledged, when appropriate, and they will be made a part of the administrative record of the application."
- 3. Consider the following in deciding when it is "appropriate" to acknowledge receipt of comments. To many citizens, writing to a federal government official is a significant act of public involvement and their interest and effort should be acknowledged. Such personalized comments should be acknowledged with assurances that the comments will be considered. However, mass-produced comments and other routine communications need not be acknowledged.
- 4. District engineers should use fast, efficient means in acknowledging comments to avoid unnecessary burdens on the operation of the regulatory program.
- 5. This guidance expires 31 December 1988 unless sooner revised or rescinded.
