## **Regulatory Guidance Letter 88-07**

## SUBJECT: Certification of Compliance with Permit Terms and Conditions by Permittees

DATE: July 5, 1988

EXPIRES: December 31, 1990

District engineers are required to maintain an effective compliances program. See 33 CFR Part 326 and Regulatory Guidance Letter 87-6. As part of such a program, district engineers may include the enclosed certification in permit packages for use by permittees to certify compliance with the terms and 00conditions of their individual permits.

The intent of this certification is to increase the effectiveness of our compliance program within our limited resources. This certification is a tool to gain voluntary compliance with the terms and conditions of permits. It is not a separate permit requirement and should not be enforced as such. Again, the purpose is to gain voluntary compliance not to get all the certifications back.

In addition, district engineers should seek, where necessary to maintain an effective compliance program, other non-traditional methods of checking for compliance. For example, where a state permit program exists you may be able to arrange to get copies of state inspection reports.

This guidance expires 31 December 1990 unless sooner revised or rescinded.
