This letter is to formally notify the Eastern Federal Lands Highway Division that the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Louisville District, desires inspection of two public bridges under the terms of Agreement No. DTFH71-94-A-00013. The bridges involved are listed as follows:

(1) Littcarr Campground Site Access Bridge located at Carr Fork Lake, Kentucky.

(2) The Bascule Bridge located at McAlpine Locks and Dam, Louisville, Kentucky.

It is requested that the structures be inspected on a two-year cycle, beginning with Fiscal Year 94. The inspection type should be routine. As-built plans, inventory and appraisal sheets, latest inspection report and project brochure (for directions) are enclosed for each structure. As per the Agreement, please forward a request and justification for funds at least 60 days prior to the scheduled work. Upon receipt of this information and prior to the work being accomplished, this office will transfer the justified funds.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

AMONG

DEPARTMENT OF ARMY
CORPS OF ENGINEERS
LOUISVILLE DISTRICT

AND

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION
FEDERAL HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION

FOR

BRIDGE INVENTORY AND INSPECTION SERVICES

WHEREAS, the US Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) desires to conform to the intent of Section 116(d) of Title 23, United States Code, which provides for the proper safety inspections of bridges; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) is authorized under Section 308 of Title 23, United States Code, to perform engineering or other services in connection with the survey, construction, or improvement of highways for other Government agencies;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Corps and the FHWA do hereby mutually agree to the following:

1. SCOPE AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. The Corps will provide the FHWA with a complete inventory of all bridges to be inspected. This inventory will be accompanied by any maps required to show the actual locations of the structures. The inventory will indicate the use of the structures. Updates to the inventory, and any other required information, will be submitted to the FHWA upon request.
- B. The Corps will provide copies of the as-built plans and design criteria for each structure whenever this information is available.
- C. The FHWA will inspect all bridges listed in the inventory provided by the Corps, in accordance with the National Bridge Inspection Standards, 23 CFR 650. All public structures will be inspected on a 2-year cycle, beginning with Fiscal Year (FY) 94. All non-public structures will be inspected on a 5-year cycle, beginning in FY 96.
- D. The FHWA will prepare and submit to the Corps a Bridge Inspection Report and a Bridge Inventory and Appraisal Coding Sheet for each structure inspected. A review of the structural analysis will be performed for the specific bridges noted on the inventory submitted by the Corps.
- E. The FHWA will be responsible for processing and reporting data.

2. METHODS

- A. The FHWA shall perform the inspections in accordance with existing Bridge Inspection Program procedures.
- B. The Corps, upon request by the FHWA, will provide personnel to assist the FHWA in the work. This assistance will include providing any additional maps or bridge data requested and providing flagmen, barricades, and any other safety services necessary to accomplish the work.
- C. The FHWA will maintain a continuing record system on the inspections performed. Status reports as to the numbers of inspections and costs to date will be available to the Corps upon request.


3. FUNDING

- A. The FHWA will request all funds needed for cyclic inspections at the beginning of the fiscal year, and at least 60 days prior to the scheduled work. The Corps will transfer the requested funds for that fiscal year prior to the work being accomplished. The FHWA will provide backup data, as requested by the Corps, to justify the requested funds.
- B. The Corps will notify the FHWA if funds will not be available within 30 days of receipt of the funding request.
- C. The FHWA will return any and all unexpended funds to the Corps.

4. MODIFICATION OF THIS MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This Memorandum of Agreement may be modified as mutually agreed by both the Corps and the FHWA.
