

Hails & Farewells





It has been a busy month for the Headhunters. The company's cooks prepared two meals a day to ensure the candidates received nourishment for their long, demanding days on their newly fielded Containerized Kitchen.

If you are interested in learning more, the ACS holds classes at the Resiliency Campus from 4-6pm on Tuesdays.

We closed out May with a great FRG event – Family PT and breakfast. The Families and Soldiers had a fun time working out together; Family members experienced the new Physical Readiness Program's exercises and some even got to run while calling cadences. It was a wonderful opportunity to share what we do each day with those who support us as we do it. The next FRG event is a picnic at Moon Lake on 5 July. Please join us starting at 10am and bring a side dish or dessert to share.

The summer months show no sign of slowing down for the Soldiers of HHC. We have two Range Weeks at the end of June as well as a brigade Staff Assistance Visit. Both events will require preparation and long hours by the Soldiers in order to be successful. In July, the company will be focused on "cleaning" out our areas by turning in excess equipment and preparing for the division Reset Assistance Visit at the end of the month. Wrapping up the summer, the focus of August and September will be on training and field exercises. The company will be having a training week from 13-17 August and again from 4-7 September. However, even with all the tasks ahead of us, individuals will have the opportunity to take block leave either in July or August depending on their section's mission requirements.

As always, 1SG Giddens and I are proud of our Soldiers' accomplishments. SPC Rouse and SPC Smithers recently graduated from the Warriors Leaders Course while SFC Dewitt and SFC Wernholm completed the Senior Leaders Course; SFC Dewitt earned recognition on the Commandant's List. Additionally we re-enlisted three Soldiers (SPC Flowers, SPC Sakaye, and SPC Yon) and promoted three NCOs (SGT Mosinger, SGT Pace, and MSG Thap). We continue to bid farewell to Soldiers and Officers departing Fort Riley and welcome new members to the Headhunters Family. We thank the Families for their continued support and dedication to their Soldiers and to the unit.
