


STATE PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME 2010

Per capita personal income (personal income divided by population) rose 2.8 percent nationally in 2010 after falling 5.1 percent in 2009. Across states, per capita personal income growth ranged from 1.1 percent in Nevada to 7.9 percent in North Dakota.
