Overview of the Amendment 66 Community Quota Entity (CQE) Program

In 2004 (69 FR 23681, April 20, 2004) Amendment 66 was implemented to help smaller communities that have had a decline in quota holdings. The original group of 42 remote Gulf of Alaska coastal communities received approval to purchase, hold, and use commercial halibut and sablefish catcher vessel quota share in the Gulf of Alaska (Halibut Areas 2C, 3A, and 3B and Sablefish area SE, WY CG and WG). These communities are eligible to form a non-profit entity (Community Quota Entity, or CQE) to hold and lease the quota to individual community residents. This amendment was developed to assist a number of small coastal communities in Southeast and Southcentral Alaska to increase or maintain their participation in the commercial halibut and sablefish fisheries.

As the halibut and sablefish IFQ Program increased the cost of entry and expansion in these commercial fisheries also increased. Several years after implementation, some larger Gulf communities appear to have benefited from the program and continue to increase their participation in the IFQ fisheries, while other smaller communities have experienced a significant decline in participation. The Council began considering amendments for communities in the commercial IFQ Program in June 2000, motivated by several provisions in the Magnuson Stevens Act, recommendations by the National Research Council (NRC), and a proposal from the Gulf of Alaska Coastal Communities Coalition (Coalition).

The concern is that because these remote communities are dependent on fisheries for a large portion of their employment and income and have few alternative economic opportunities, a decline in the number of quota share holders has a severe effect on unemployment and related social and economic impacts. The objective of this program was to allow qualifying communities to purchase halibut and sablefish quota share for lease to, and use by, community residents. This is intended to address the identified problem without undermining the goals of the IFQ Program or precluding entry-level opportunities for fishermen residing in other fishery dependent communities. Amendment 66 was implemented in 2004.

Eight years after the implementation of Amendment 66, there has been only two community (Ouzinkie and Old Harbor) that has formed a CQE, purchased quota, and is actively fishing this quota. Half of the other eligible communities have the structure in place to purchase quota but have been unable to come up with the necessary funds.¹

The Council formally adopted the following problem statement for this amendment package: A small number of small costal communities in Southeast and Southcentral Alaska are struggling to remain economically viable. The halibut and sablefish IFQ program, as with other limited entry programs, increases the cost of entry into or expansion in the commercial halibut and sablefish fishery. Allowing qualifying communities to purchase halibut and sablefish quota shares for lease to and use by community residents will help minimize adverse economic impacts on these small, remote, coastal communities in Southeast and Southcentral Alaska, and help provide for sustained participation of these communities in the halibut and sablefish IFQ fisheries. The council seeks to provide for this sustained participation without undermining the goals of the halibut and sablefish IFQ program or precluding entry-level opportunities for fishermen residing in other fishery dependant communities.

Communities with less than 1,500 people, no road access to larger communities, direct access to saltwater, and a documented historic participation in the halibut or sablefish fisheries are eligible to hold and use commercial catcher vessel halibut and sablefish quota share. Originally, forty-two Gulf of Alaska communities qualify under these criteria.

The Council required that in addition to meeting these criteria at final action, eligible communities must be listed as a defined set of eligible communities in Federal regulation. Communities not meeting the qualifying criteria and not on the list adopted by the Council are not eligible to participate. Other communities can petition the Council for inclusion after the implementation of this program.

Ownership Entity

The Council recommended that new nonprofit organizations be formed explicitly for the purpose of purchasing and holding QS on behalf of communities. These nonprofit entities may each represent one or more eligible communities.

Individual Community Use Caps

Eligible communities are limited to purchasing and using 1% of the Area 2C and 0.5% of the combined Area 2C, 3A, and 3B halibut QS, and 1% of Southeast and 1% of all combined sablefish QS. Eligible communities in Areas 3A and 3B cannot buy halibut QS in Area 2C and eligible communities in Area 2C cannot buy halibut QS in Area 3B.

Cumulative Community Use Caps

Communities are limited to holding and using 3% per area of the Area 2C, 3A, or 3Bhalibut QS and 3% of the SE, WY, CG, or WG sablefish QS the first year of the program, with an increase of 3% per year to a maximum of 21% in the seventh and later years.

Purchase, Use and Sale Provisions

Original block and vessel size designations apply if the community transfers the QS to any person other than another eligible community. These restrictions would help ensure that the goal of providing access to local residents is maintained and limit the potential for QS to be leased to larger vessels, presumably owned by non-residents fishing further

from shore. These restrictions would also address an array of concerns about the distribution of QS among prospective new community entities and existing or future individual participants.²

As stated previously, there has been very little quota purchased since the implementation of the program in 2004, primarily due to the difficulty in financing the purchase, high quota share prices, and quota share availability. However, half of the eligible communities have formed CQEs and are trying to develop strategies to purchase quota.

Since the implementation of Amendment 66, two fishing privileges have been added to the CQE program. These two revisions allow CQE programs to guided sport halibut fishery in Areas 2C and 3A and fixed gear permits for Pacific cod in the Western and Central Gulf

The limited entry program for halibut charter was recently approved by the Secretary; it establishes a new requirement that charter businesses meet criteria and hold a charter permit for halibut charter fishing in Areas 2C and 3A. It also allows for CQEs to request a limited number of permits at no cost, depending on the area. Thus, new charter businesses in these communities, or existing businesses that did not meet the qualification requirements for a charter permit, could potentially lease a community halibut charter permit from the CQE and lower the cost of entry into or expansion in the charter halibut fishery. Since this time there are currently 123 guided sport halibut CQE listed as being eligible to fish under this program. The fixed gear Pacific cod fishery is a slightly different situation. The Council's overall action would remove existing latent licenses from the fixed gear Pacific cod fisheries in the Gulf, including those from residents of eligible CQE communities. The Council then recommended that NMFS issue a number of permits to each COE equivalent to the number estimated to be removed from residents of the represented community, or two permits, whichever is greater, such that access to Pacific cod remain as a long-term community asset. In sum, the expansion of the base of community holdings beyond that of halibut and sablefish QS may help further the CQE Program, and in fact, may allow CQEs to leverage their assets such that purchases of halibut and sablefish QS become more financially feasible.³
