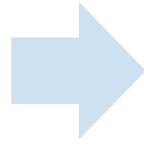


What is Challenge.gov?

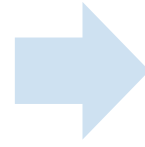
A central platform for government challenges, managed by the General Services Administration (GSA), where agencies can...



Launch contests (a.k.a. "challenges") easily



Invite the public to come up with innovative and creative solutions to problems



Reward solvers with prizes, which can be monetary or non-monetary

Why was Challenge.gov created?

GSA launched Challenge.gov in September of 2010 to support the President's Strategy for American Innovation. It allows government to tap into the creativity of the American people, so they can contribute their ideas to solve our nation's most pressing problems.

You can find all types of challenges on the site.

There are challenges to create videos, games and mobile apps, write software, design innovative systems, and invent products that can solve the grand challenges of our time.
