Narrative: The Cramer Fire was first detected on Sunday afternoon, July 20, 2003. On Tuesday, July 22 at approximately 1600 hrs two wildland fire helicopter rappellers, Jeff Allen, 24, and Shane Heath, 22, were burned over and suffered fatal injuries. Mr. Allen and Mr. Heath were preparing a heli-spot uphill from the fire in dry flashy fuels at the time of the incident.

Terrain at the fatality site consisted of 60 to 70% slopes with a south facing aspect. Temperatures in the Salmon - Lemhi area were near 100 F, relative humidity was less than 20%, and observed winds were out of the northwest at 14 mph with gusts to 21 mph.
