## THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION IS PRELIMINARY AND SUBJECT TO CHANGE

Location: Mailbox Wildland Fire, Osceola Ranger District, Florida National Forests

Date/Time of occurrence: May 13, 2004, 1700 Hours (Approximately)

Narrative: At approximately 1200 hours on May 13, 2004, U. S. Forest Service and Florida Division of Forestry firefighters responded to a wildland fire on the Osceola Ranger District near Lake City, Florida. A U. S. Forest Service firefighter died while working on the fireline. The deceased firefighter was assigned as a Safety Officer on the incident.

The fire was contained later in the day at 95 acres in size.

The investigation is ongoing. At this point in the investigation it does not appear that the death of the firefighter was the result of an entrapment or burnover. The investigation team is awaiting results of an autopsy and continuing with investigation of other aspects of the incident.
