Unexpected extreme fire behavior lead to an entrapment situation involving two Forest Service engines, chase rig, their crews and a contract bulldozer on a flat-bed when their escape route was blocked. Resources pulled back to an opening, began burning out light fuels, retreated to vehicles and immediately experienced a burn over.
