

Department of Pediatrics and provides
developmental services for eligible children
who are inpatient in the NICU or Pediatric
Ward or as an outpatient in the clinic.

## Who is eligible?

- Military dependents who are DEERS eligible from birth to 36 months of age and at risk or demonstrating developmental challenges. If a child resides on the military installation, they will likely be referred to Educational and Developmental Intervention Services (EDIS) for evaluation and intervention.

## Specialty Services

- Neonatal Developmental Follow-up Services—Assessment and treatment for high risk infants who required neonatal intensive care services
- Pediatric Feeding Services Evaluation and treatment of feeding disorders
- Auditory Brainstem Response (ABR) and
   OtoAcoustic Emissions (OAE) Testing
   for infants and children unable to be assessed via conventional audiological
   evaluations
- Physical and Occupational Therapy Services Focusing on treatment of acute neurodevelopmental problems, torticollis, plagiocephaly and developmental care of preterm infants
