## Chapter 6, Paragraph 122, read:

Sullivan Falls, locally known as The Tidal Falls, are reversing falls in the constricted reach between Crabtree Neck and Falls Point, about 0.5 mile northwestward of Ferry Point. The channel through the falls is obstructed by ledges and the tidal currents are swift and dangerous. Navigation through the falls is safe only at slack water. Most craft go up on the last of the flood, but come out only at high water slack as there is great turbulence whenever the current is running at strength. The cove on the west side just at the bottom of the falls has a lobster pound, and there is a wharf and float landing, with 15 feet alongside, on the north side of the cove. Gasoline, diesel fuel, and water are available at the wharf.

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
