NEW ORLEANS -- The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will hold a public information meeting and open house this Saturday in its continuing effort to inform the community on the status of the Mississippi Gulf River Outlet Deep-Draft De-authorization (MRGO-3D) Report and to solicit comments from the public. At the meeting, attendees will have the opportunity to ask questions regarding the MRGO-3D draft final report as well as the Draft Legislative Environmental Impact Statement, which is anticipated to be completed by the Corps and provided to Congress in December 2007.

Congress authorized construction of the MRGO in 1956 to allow navigation a safer and quicker route between the Gulf of Mexico and the Port of New Orleans. Congress has now directed the Corps to develop a comprehensive plan to de-authorize deep-draft shipping on the MRGO from the Gulf of Mexico to the Gulf Intracoastal Waterway.

The Final MRGO 3-D Report will be part of the Louisiana Coastal Protection and Restoration (LACPR) Report, and is due to Congress in December 2007.
