Background. The conference continues a discussion between the Corps and the Dutch engineers on the LaCPR Project. There have been three sessions in Holland; this is the first in the United States. The effort began shortly after Hurricane Katrina and has involved close coordination and cooperation in many technical areas. Sharing of technical data will assist the LaCPR project team to propose increased hurricane protection.

The Dutch engineers are also interested in learning about emergency evacuation procedures and emergency response to disasters. Representatives from the state of Louisiana will present on this topic.
