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## **Baton Rouge Small Business Receives Levee Repair Contract**

New Orleans – A contract to perform levee repair work in Plaquemines Parish has been awarded to the Baton Rouge, La., firm of Purnell Construction. The contract includes clearing and grubbing, excavation, and placing semi-compacted fill and armor stone, and was awarded for \$1,878,726 under the Small Business Administration's 8(a) Business Development Program.

The contract also includes surfacing on borrow access roads, fertilizing, seeding, and other incidental work in the Reach C Levee area, which was hit hard as Hurricane Katrina made landfall on the Louisiana coast on Aug. 29.

The project is part of the mission assigned by the Army Corps' Mississippi Valley Division Commander, Brig. Gen. Robert Crear, to Task Force Guardian.

Task Force Guardian's assignment is to restore federal levees that provide hurricane and flood protection to the area to a pre-Katrina level of performance by June 1, 2006.
