

#### HBCU/MI Program

Historically Black Colleges and Universities and Minority Institutions (HBCU/MIs) Program was established as a result of the National Defense Authorization Act of 1987 and DoD Authorization Act of 1988 and further emphasized by Executive Order 12928 in 1994. The purpose of the program is to promote participation of HBCU/MIs in Federal procurements. These laws were enacted to provide contracts, grants, and/or cooperative agreements with HBCU/MIs, Tribal Colleges and Hispanic Institutions. Procurement opportunities for receiving research, studies, supplies or services contracts and grants of the type normally acquired from higher educational institutions are available for HRCII/MIs.

### Program Eligibility

Academic Institutions must meet the eligibility criteria based on the definition of minority institution at Sections 1046(3) and 316(b)(1) of the Higher Education Act (HEA) of 1965 as amended and on the latest enrollment data from the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) collected by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES).
