








AF AND NAF ACCIDENT REDUCTION











Recordable Accidents (R)






INCREASE EMPLOYEE AWARENESS:

• BRIEF/DISSEMINATE <u>FINAL RESULTS OF THE ACCIDENT</u> <u>INVESTIGATION AND QTRLY ACCIDENT STATS ANALYSIS</u> THROUGHOUT THE LEADERSHIP CHAIN DOWN TO FIRST-LINE SUPERVISORS. FIRST-LINE SUPERVISORS BRIEF THEIR EMPLOYEES.

TREND FOCUSED TRAINING :

• AS SCHEDULED ON PERIODIC BASIS: UNTIL THE TRENDS STOP.

LEADER EMPHASIS:

•TOP DOWN DIRECTOR EMPHASIS WITH FOCUS ON ACCIDENT TRENDS AND ENFORCEMENT OF SAFETY STANDARDS: DIRECTORS/ DIVISION CHIEFS / FIRST LINE SUPERVISORS / INCLUDE EMPLOYEE RESPONSIBILITIES.

Fort Campbell Snow and Ice Removal Program

(CAM REG 420-8) (23 Sep 10)







The Program

- Proponent of the program is DPW.
- CAM REG 420-8 establishes plan and responsibilities.
- Decision making is at the GC level.
- Physical removal of snow and ice to eliminate the hazards for:
 - Essential Personnel
 - Vehicle Movement
 - Aircraft Operations

Who are the Players

- Garrison Commander & Designated Staff Elements
- Emergency Operations Center (EOC)
- Directorate of Emergency Services (DES)
- Directorate of Public Works (DPW)
- Airfield Commander or Chief, Campbell Army Airfield
 - Also, Sabre Army Heliport
- 101st Airborne (Air Assault) Division
- Facility Managers & Occupants (includes tenant units and activities)
- Family Housing Occupants







- 1. 101st Abn Div Rd from Lee Rd to Sabre AH
- 2. All Entrance roads from US 41A to Wickham Ave (order: gates 4, 1, 3, 7, 6, 2, 5, Reed Ave to 35th St to Wickham Ave, Glider Rd to CAAF entrance)
- 3. Flight line priorities (AFLD Cdr)
- 4. Bastogne Ave, Tennessee Ave, Wickham Ave, Desert Storm Ave, Indiana Ave, A Shau Valley Rd, Strike Blvd, California Ave, & Loop Rd
- 5. Div HQ and T-39 parking lots & Michigan Ave







- 1. Dependant schools access roads, parking lots, & bus routes (only on school days)
- 2. Dreyer Field House, In/Out Processing, PX, Commissary, Post Office, CDC's, FRC, Installation Maintenance Facility, Transportation Office, DOL, DPW Compound and Facilities, Library, TMP, Procurement Office, Shoppettes, & Chapels







- 1. Market Garden Rd & Hedgerow Rd
- 2. Clarksville Base and ASP, Mabry Rd, Angles Rd, Perimeter Rd
- 3. 3rd St, 19th St, & 23rd St
- 4. Screaming Eagle Blvd, 28th St, 29th St, 46th St, 49th St, 52nd St, 53rd St, & 57th St







- 1. Destiny Heliport (hangar parking)
- 2. Family Housing Areas
- 3. Morgan Road
- 4. Sabre Army Heliport (parking)
- 5. Campbell Army Airfield (streets & parking)
- 6. Stillwell Rd, 11th St, 18th St, 52nd St, 16th St, 101 Abn Div Rd from Sabre to US 79
- 7. Streets, roads, & parking areas not mentioned above (as assigned by DPW/EOC or tenant support units)




Snow and Ice Removal Program



Don't Forget Risk Management

- Timely risk management must be a priority consideration for those conducting actual removal operations (CRM or JHA).
- Operational Risk Considerations: METT-TC
 - Mission
 - Enemy (anything that would hamper the mission)
 - Terrain & Weather (route and environmental conditions)
 - Troops (personnel, equipment and support available)
 - Time Available
 - Civil Considerations (infrastructure, traffic, pedestrians)



- Facility Managers are responsible for snow and Ice removal from steps, walks, landings & similar areas adjacent to their buildings.
- Salt may be picked up at DPW, Roads and Grounds Division @ Tennessee Ave. and 1st Street. It is in a frontend loader in the parking lot near bldg 5115. Bring your own bucket and shovel.
