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**Part 1 Basic Provisions**

**1 Handbook Purpose and Coverage**

**A Handbook Purpose**

This handbook provides procedure for applying reductions to:

- DCP or ACRE payments for:
  - acre-for-acre payment reductions
  - FAV planting and reporting violations
  - maintenance defaults
- CRP payments for maintenance defaults.

**B Handbook Coverage**

This handbook covers the following programs:

- DCP
- ACRE
- CRP.

**Note:** Use applicable program handbooks along with instructions in this handbook.

## 2 Authorities

### A Sources of Authority

The sources of authority for payment reduction provisions are the following:

- Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008
- Commodity Credit Corporation Charter Act, as amended.

### B STC Authority to Supplement This Handbook

Do **not** withdraw any procedure in this handbook.

This handbook may be supplemented with STC policies that have received DAFP authorization. See 1-AS for proper supplementation procedures.

## 3 Information Accessibility

### A Access to Farm and Farm Records

Any authorized representative of the Secretary shall have access to farms and farm records to make determinations on eligibility and compliance.

**Note:** Producers must provide any information necessary to establish eligibility for program benefits.

### B FOIA

See 2-INFO for records available to the public.

## 4 Responsibilities

### A County Office Responsibilities

COC's shall ensure that CED's follow provisions in this handbook.

CED's shall inform COC's of policy for proper administration when all program requirements have **not** been met by the producer.

COC shall:

- when authorized, make final determinations based on the merits of each case and document the entire case in COC minutes
- send complete, documented cases to STC for determination when COC is **not** authorized to make the final determination.

**4 Responsibilities (Continued)**

**B State Office Responsibilities**

SED's shall ensure that all County Offices follow provisions in this handbook.

STC's shall:

- make determinations for cases that exceed COC authority
- provide DD with a copy of STC or DAFP determinations for appeals or misaction or misinformation cases
- send complete, documented cases to DAFP for determination when STC is not authorized to make a determination.

DD's shall conduct the followup review to ensure that the County Office has carried out DAFP- or STC-approved action by:

- initialing and dating the County Office case file to signify that the case has been reviewed
- initialing and returning a copy of the STC determination to STC to document that the approved action has been taken.

## Part 2 FAV/WR Authorized Plantings

### 20 Overview

#### A Authorized Plantings

FAV/WR may be planted on base acres enrolled in DCP or ACRE and be considered an authorized planting when 1 of the following exceptions applies:

- FAV/WR is double-cropped with a covered commodity or peanuts in an established FAV/WR double-cropping region, according to 1-DCP (Rev. 3), paragraph 472
- farm has history of planting FAV/WR, according to 1-DCP (Rev. 3), paragraph 476, and an acre-for-acre reduction is applied to the farm, according to paragraph 21
- producer has history of planting a specific FAV/WR, according to 1-DCP (Rev. 3), paragraph 478, and an acre-for-acre reduction is applied to the farm according to paragraph 21.

**Note:** The producer history exception is crop and acreage specific. If FAV/WR for which the producer does not have an established history of planting is planted on base acres, the planting is **not** an authorized planting.

#### B Unauthorized Plantings

For unauthorized plantings, the planting violation provisions shall be applied according to paragraph 31.

**21 Acre-for-Acre Reductions****A Applicability**

Farms with FAV/WR planted on base acres enrolled in DCP or ACRE shall have DCP or ACRE payments reduced for each acre of FAV/WR planted on base acres, unless the double-cropping exception in subparagraph 20 A applies. Acre-for-acre reductions apply when FAV/WR is planted on base acres enrolled in DCP or ACRE and any of the following apply:

- farm has a history of planting FAV/WR
- producer has a history of planting the specific FAV/WR and the number of acres planted does not exceed the producer history
- farm is in violation, but COC determines that the violation does not warrant terminating CCC-509 according to subparagraph 31 D.

**Important:** See paragraph 31 for additional payment reductions.

**Note:** Nonperennial FAV/WR planted on base acres enrolled in DCP or ACRE that are destroyed before harvest shall **not** be considered DCP or ACRE violations nor shall DCP or ACRE payments for the farm be reduced for such plantings, if the provisions in 1-DCP (Rev. 3), subparagraph 470 E are met.

21 Acre-for-Acre Reductions (Continued)

**B Determining Acres To Be Reduced**

County Offices shall determine whether FAV/WR is planted on base acres enrolled in DCP or ACRE according to this table.

**Important:** All producers on base acres must share in the following:

- direct and counter-cyclical payments according to 1-DCP (Rev. 3), paragraph 352, if participating in DCP
- direct payments according to 1-DCP (Rev. 3), paragraph 352, if participating in ACRE.

Therefore, if multiple producers exist on a farm and a producer on the farm does not share in CCC-509, then that producer is being represented as not farming base acres. Any crop planted by the producer with zero interest in CCC-509 shall be considered planted on nonbase acres on the farm. See 1-DCP (Rev. 3), subparagraphs 471 H and I for farm examples.

See subparagraph H for an example of determining FAV/WR acres planted on base acres when a producer with zero interest in CCC-509 exists on the farm.

Step	Action	
1	Determine if all producers on the farm share in CCC-509.	
	<b>IF all producers on the farm...</b>	<b>THEN nonbase acreage on the farm is equal to the result of the farm's effective DCP cropland, minus the...</b>
	share in CCC-509	total base acres for the farm.  If the result is equal to or less than zero, the farm is fully based; therefore, the result is equal to zero.
	do <b>not</b> share in CCC-509	farm's effective DCP cropland, minus the sum of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• total base acres for the farm, plus</li> <li>• total non-FAV/WR acres planted by producers with zero interest in the farm's CCC-509.</li> </ul> If the result is equal to or less than zero, the portion of the farm that is controlled by DCP or ACRE producers is fully based; therefore, the result is equal to zero.

21 Acre-for-Acre Reductions (Continued)

B Determining Acres To Be Reduced (Continued)

Step	Action	
2	Subtract the result of step 1 from the total acres of FAV/WR planted on the farm.  <b>Important:</b> The total acreage of FAV/WR planted on the farm includes FAV/WR acreage planted by producers with zero interest in the farm's CCC-509.  <b>Note:</b> Only count the acreage once when multiple plantings of FAV/WR are planted on the same acreage. See 1-DCP (Rev. 3), paragraph 469.	
3	<b>IF the result of step 2 is...</b>	<b>THEN...</b>
	equal to or less than zero	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• FAV/WR are <b>not</b> planted on base acres</li> <li>• acre-for-acre reduction does <b>not</b> apply to the farm.</li> </ul>
	greater than zero	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• FAV/WR are planted on base acres</li> <li>• acre-for-acre reduction applies to the farm based on the result of step 2</li> <li>• apply the acre-for-acre reduction to the farm according to paragraph 22.</li> </ul>

C FAV and WR Planted on Base Acres Report

The payment reduction software provides a FAV and WR Planted Base Acres Report to assist County Offices in determining the number of base acres planted to FAV/WR on a farm. See paragraph 67 for instructions on printing and using the FAV and WR Planted Base Acres Report.

**Exception:** The FAV and WR Planted on Base Acres Report does **not** reflect crops planted by a producer with zero interest in CCC-509 that are considered planted on nonbase acres. Therefore, the County Office shall manually calculate the farm's nonbase acres according to subparagraph B, step 1.



21 Acre-for-Acre Reductions (Continued)

**D Applying Acre-for-Acre Reduction When Multiple Violations Exist**

If both a reporting and planting violation exist on the same farm, the acre-for-acre reduction shall only apply 1 time to the farm.

**Examples:** If a farm has a planting violation on 10 acres and a reporting violation on 5 acres, an acre-for-acre reduction of 10 acres shall be entered in the FPR software, according to paragraph 56.

If a farm has a planting violation on 10 acres and a reporting violation on 15 acres, an acre-for-acre reduction of 15 acres shall be entered in the FPR software, according to paragraph 56.

**E Example 1**

This is an example of determining whether FAV/WR is planted on base acres enrolled in DCP for a farm with the following criteria:

- farm has a history of planting FAV/WR
- 300 acres of effective DCP cropland
- 200 base acres
- 125 planted acres of FAV/WR that are not double-cropped
- all producers on the farm share in CCC-509.

Step	Action	Result
1	Subtract the total base acres for the farm from the effective DCP cropland to determine the farm's nonbase acreage.  <b>Note:</b> If the result is less than zero, the farm has approved double-cropped acreage and is fully based; therefore, the farm has zero nonbase acres.	300 acres of effective DCP cropland minus 200 base acres equals 100 nonbase acres.
2	Subtract the result of step 1 from the total acres of FAV/WR planted on the farm.	125 acres of FAV/WR minus 100 nonbase acres equals 25 acres.
3	<b>IF the result of step 2 is...</b>	
	<b>THEN acre-for-acre reduction...</b>	
	equal to or less than zero	does <b>not</b> apply to the farm.
	greater than zero	applies to the farm based on the result of step 2.
		Both the direct and counter-cyclical payment acres for the farm shall be reduced by 25 acres.

21 Acre-for-Acre Reductions (Continued)

F Example 2

This example shows how to determine whether FAV/WR is planted on base acres enrolled in DCP on a farm with the following criteria:

- farm has a history of planting FAV’s
- 300 acres of effective DCP cropland
- 200 base acres
- 100 acres of lettuce, 25 acres of peppers, and 85 acres of tomatoes that were not double-cropped

**Note:** The peppers and 75 acres of tomatoes were planted on the lettuce acreage after it was harvested.

- all producers on the farm share in CCC-509.

Step	Action		Result
1	Subtract the total base acres for the farm from the effective DCP cropland to determine the farm’s nonbase acreage.  <b>Note:</b> If the result is less than zero, the farm has approved double-cropped acreage and is fully based; therefore, the farm has zero nonbase acres.		300 acres of effective DCP cropland minus 200 base acres equals 100 nonbase acres.
2	Subtract the result of step 1 from the total acres of FAV/WR planted on the farm.		110 acres of FAV/WR minus 100 nonbase acres equals 10 acres.  <b>Note:</b> The peppers and 75 acres of tomatoes are not counted because they were double-cropped with lettuce.
3	<b>IF the result of step 1 is...</b>	<b>THEN...</b>	
	equal to or less than zero	no acre-for-acre reduction applies.	
	greater than zero	acre-for-acre reduction applies to the farm.	Both the direct and counter-cyclical payment acres for the farm shall be reduced by 10 acres.

21 Acre-for-Acre Reductions (Continued)

G Example 3

This example shows how to determine whether FAV/WR is planted on base acres enrolled in ACRE on a farm with the following criteria:

- farm has a history of planting FAV/WR
- 300 acres of effective DCP cropland
- 310 base acres
- 125 planted acres of FAV/WR that are not double-cropped
- all producers on the farm share in CCC-509.

Step	Action		Result
1	Subtract the total base acres for the farm from the effective DCP cropland to determine the farm’s nonbase acreage.  <b>Note:</b> If the result is less than zero, the farm has approved double-cropped acreage and is fully based; therefore the farm has zero nonbase acres.		300 acres of effective DCP cropland minus 310 base acres equals -10 acres; therefore, the farm has zero nonbase acres.
2	Subtract the result of step 1 from the total acres of FAV/WR planted on the farm.		125 acres of FAV/WR minus zero nonbase acres equals 125 acres.
3	<b>IF the result of step 2 is...</b>	<b>THEN acre-for-acre reduction...</b>	
	equal to or less than zero	does <b>not</b> apply to the farm.	
	greater than zero	applies to the farm based on the result of step 2.	The direct payment acres for the farm shall be reduced by 125 acres.

21 Acre-for-Acre Reductions (Continued)

H Example 4

This example shows how to determine FAV/WR acreage planted on base acres enrolled in DCP on a farm with the following criteria:

- 300 acres of effective DCP cropland
- 200 base acres
- 2 producers, Producer A and B, exist on the farm
- Producer A shares 100 percent in CCC-509
- Producer B has zero interest in CCC-509 and controls 55 acres on the farm, of which he plants 50 acres of corn and 5 acres of tomatoes
- farm has a history of planting FAV/WR
- 125 planted acres of FAV/WR (includes the 5 acres of tomatoes planted by Producer B) that are not double-cropped.

Step	Action	Result
1	Farm’s effective DCP cropland, minus the sum of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• total base acres for the farm, plus</li> <li>• total non-FAV/WR acres planted by producers with zero interest in the farm’s CCC-509.</li> </ul>	300 acres of effective DCP cropland minus the sum of: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 200 base acres for the farm, plus</li> <li>• 50 acres of non-FAV/WR planted by Producer B.</li> </ul> Equals 50 nonbase acres.
2	Subtract the result of Step 1 from the total acres of FAV/WR planted on the farm.  <b>Important:</b> The total acres of FAV/WR planted on the farm include any FAV/WR planted by producers with zero interest in the farm’s CCC-509.	125 acres of FAV/WR planted on the farm minus 50 nonbase acres equals 75 acres.
3	<b>IF the result of step 2 is...</b>	
	equal to or less than zero	
	<b>THEN acre-for acre reduction...</b>	
	does not apply to the farm.	
	greater than zero	applies to the farm based on the result of step 2.
		Both the direct and counter-cyclical payment acres for the farm shall be reduced by 75 acres.

22 Applying Acre-for-Acre Reductions

A Procedure

The acre-for-acre reduction is applied to the farm beginning with the covered commodity having the lowest per acre direct payment.

**Note:** This may include pulse crop base acres that will not receive a direct payment.

The payment reduction software will automatically apply the acre-for-acre reduction to the farm after the County Office enters the acres of FAV/WR planted on base acres in the FAV compliance software.

**Note:** The acres of FAV/WR planted on base acres entered by the County Office may be automatically modified when the County Office enters planting violation and/or reporting violation acres for the same farm. See subparagraphs 56 C and 57 C for situations that will prompt an automatic modification to the acre-for-acre reduction acres entered in the FPR software.

This table provides the steps to manually apply the acre-for-acre reduction to the farm.

Step	Action	
1	Determine the number of FAV/WR planted on base acres enrolled in DCP according to subparagraph 21 B.	
2	For each covered commodity and peanuts, multiply the direct payment yield times the direct payment rate to determine the covered commodity or peanuts with the lowest value per acre.	
3	Subtract the result of step 1 from the payment acres for the covered commodity with the lowest value per acre.  <b>Important:</b> The payment acres, not the base acres, are reduced by the result of step 1.	
4	<b>IF the result of step 1 is...</b>	<b>THEN the acreage reduction for the applicable covered commodity or peanuts is equal to the...</b>
	less than the payment acres of the covered commodity or peanuts with the lowest value per acre	result of step 1.  Go to step 5.
	greater than the payment acres of the covered commodity or peanuts with the lowest value per acre	payment acres for that commodity.  Subtract the remaining number of acres from step 1 from the covered commodity or peanuts with the next lowest value per acre.
5	Repeat step 4 until all acres from step 1 are accounted for.	

22 Applying Acre-for-Acre Reductions (Continued)

**B Example**

This example applies the acre-for-acre reduction to the applicable covered commodities on a farm enrolled in DCP with 100 acres of FAV/WR planted on base acres enrolled in DCP.

<b>Crop</b>	<b>Yield</b>	<b>Rate</b>	<b>Amount Per Acre (Yield X Rate)</b>	<b>Payment Acres (.85 of base acres)</b>	<b>Acre-for-Acre Reduction</b>
Wheat	39	.5200	\$20.28	25	25
Corn	149	.2800	\$41.72	100	75
Cotton	2000	.0667	\$133.40	30	0
<b>Total</b>					<b>100</b>

**C Payment Limitation**

Apply acre-for-acre reductions to DCP payments **before** applying payment limitation.

23 **Adjusting Acre-for-Acre Reductions**

**A Adjustments**

Producers on a farm with an acre-for-acre reduction may adjust the acre-for-acre reduction among the covered commodities and peanuts on the farm if **both** of the following apply:

- all affected parties agree in writing
- acreage reduction for the covered commodity or peanuts does not exceed the payment acres for the covered commodity.

**B Example**

This example shows how acre-for-acre reductions among covered commodities on a farm may be adjusted. Continuing with the example in subparagraph 22 B, the farm has 100 acres of FAV/WR planted on base acres. The Acre-For-Acre Default column shown provides the acreage reduction for each covered commodity based on applying the reduction to the covered commodities with the lowest value per acre, as calculated in subparagraph 22 B. This is the acre-for-acre reduction default method. The Acre-For-Acre Adjustment column shown provides the adjustment of the acre-for-acre reduction, among the covered commodities on the farm based on the fact that the producer, who receives the payments for corn, planted FAV/WR on base acres.

<b>Crop</b>	<b>Payment Acres</b>	<b>Acre-For-Acre Default</b>	<b>Acre-For-Acre Adjustment</b>
Wheat	25	25	0
Corn	100	75	100
Cotton	30	0	0
<b>Total</b>	<b>155</b>	<b>100</b>	<b>100</b>

All 100 acres could be reduced from corn payment acres because corn has sufficient payment acres to cover the entire acre-for-acre reduction. However, after the acre-for-acre reduction, there will not be a direct or counter-cyclical payment for corn.

**Note:** The acre-for-acre default will always result in a smaller payment reduction for the farm because acres are reduced beginning with the covered commodity with the lowest value per acre. If producers elect to adjust payment acres, it will result in a larger payment reduction for the farm.

**Part 3 DCP Violations****31 FAV/WR Planting Violations****A Applicability**

FAV/WR planting violations occur when **all** of the following apply:

- FAV/WR are planted on base acres enrolled in DCP or ACRE
- there is no farm or producer history of planting FAV/WR
- FAV/WR double-cropping region exception does **not** apply
- producer has history of planting FAV/WR and **either** of the following apply:
  - planted FAV/WR is not FAV/WR for which the producer has a history
  - planted FAV/WR acreage is in excess of the producer history.

**Note:** Nonperennial FAV/WR planted on base acres enrolled in DCP or ACRE that are destroyed before harvest shall **not** be considered a DCP or ACRE violation nor shall DCP or ACRE payments for the farm be reduced for such plantings, if the provisions in 1-DCP (Rev. 3), subparagraph 470 E are met.

County Office shall calculate producer history according to 1-DCP (Rev. 3), paragraph 478 before notifying producers of FAV/WR violations.

**B DCP Payment Reduction**

Planting violations, calculated according to subparagraph F, will be reduced from both the direct and counter-cyclical payments for the farm for the applicable year until the planting violation is satisfied.

**Important:** DCP or ACRE planting violations will not be reduced from DCP or ACRE payments of other farms in which the producer has an interest for the applicable year or subsequent years.

31 FAV/WR Planting Violations (Continued)

C Acres in Violation

County Offices shall determine whether there is a planting violation on the farm according to subparagraph A and provisions in 1-DCP (Rev. 3). If a planting violation has occurred on the farm, the County Office shall use this table to determine how many acres are in violation.

**Important:** All producers on base acres must share in direct and counter-cyclical payments according to 1-DCP (Rev. 3), paragraph 352. Therefore, if multiple producers exist on a farm and a producer on the farm does not share in CCC-509, then that producer is being represented as not farming base acres. Any crop planted by the producer with zero interest in CCC-509, shall be considered planted on nonbase acres on the farm.

Step	Action	
1	Determine if all producers on the farm share in CCC-509.	
	<b>IF all producers on the farm...</b>  share in CCC-509	<b>THEN nonbase acreage on the farm is equal to the result of the farm's effective DCP cropland, minus...</b>  total base acres for the farm.  If the result is equal to or less than zero, the farm is fully based; therefore, the result is equal to zero.
	do not share in CCC-509	the sum of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• total base acres for the farm, plus</li> <li>• total non-FAV/WR acres planted by producers with zero interest in the farm's CCC-509.</li> </ul> If the result is equal to or less than zero, the portion of the farm that is controlled by DCP or ACRE producers is fully based; therefore, the result is equal to zero.

31 FAV/WR Planting Violations (Continued)

C Acres in Violation (Continued)

Step	Action	
2	Subtract the result of step 1 from the total acres of FAV/WR planted on the farm.  <b>Important:</b> The total acreage FAV/WR planted on the farm includes FAV/WR acreage planted by producers with zero interest in the farm's CCC-509.  <b>Note:</b> Only count the acreage once when multiple plantings of FAV/WR are planted on the same acreage. See 1-DCP (Rev. 3), paragraph 470.	
3	<b>IF the result of step 2 is...</b>	<b>THEN...</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• FAV/WR are <b>not</b> planted on base acres enrolled in DCP or ACRE</li> <li>• CCC-509 is <b>not</b> in violation and no further action is necessary</li> </ul> greater than zero <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• FAV/WR are planted on base acres enrolled in DCP or ACRE</li> <li>• CCC-509 is in violation, unless FAV/WR planting exception applies according to 1-DCP (Rev. 3).</li> </ul> <b>Note:</b> COC must determine whether the degree of the violation warrants terminating CCC-509 according to paragraph 35.

	greater than zero	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• FAV/WR are planted on base acres enrolled in DCP or ACRE</li> <li>• CCC-509 is in violation, unless FAV/WR planting exception applies according to 1-DCP (Rev. 3).</li> </ul> <b>Note:</b> COC must determine whether the degree of the violation warrants terminating CCC-509 according to paragraph 35.

**Important:** County Offices shall use the FAV and WR Planted on Base Acres Report to assist in determining the acreage in violation. See paragraph 67 for instructions on printing and using the FAV and WR Planted on Base Acres Report.

**Exception:** The FAV and WR Planted on Base Acres Report does not reflect crops planted by a producer with zero interest in CCC-509 that are considered planted on nonbase acres according to subparagraph 21 B. Therefore, the County Office shall manually calculate the farm's nonbase acres according to step 1 in this table.

31 FAV/WR Planting Violations (Continued)

**D Consequence of Planting Violation**

COC shall determine, with STC concurrence, whether CCC-509 shall be terminated because of FAV/WR planting violation. See paragraph 35 for guidelines for COC to consider when determining whether CCC-509 shall be terminated.

The County Office shall use this table to determine the consequences of a planting violation.

<b>IF the planting violation...</b>	<b>THEN...</b>
warrants terminating CCC-509	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• all DCP or ACRE payments previously paid to producers for the farm for the applicable year must be refunded, plus interest</li> <li>• no further DCP or ACRE payments will be made for the applicable CCC-509.</li> </ul> <p><b>Note:</b> County Office shall follow subparagraph 36 B when the degree of the violation warrants terminating CCC-509.</p>

**31 FAV/WR Planting Violations (Continued)****E Apply Acre-for-Acre Reduction**

When COC determines that the planting violation does not warrant terminating CCC-509, an acre-for-acre reduction must be applied to the farm according to Part 2, in addition to the planting violation payment reduction calculated according to subparagraph F.

**Important:** If a reporting violation also exists on the same farm, the acre-for-acre reduction will only be applied once to the farm.

**F Calculating Planting Violation**

Planting violation payment reductions are based on the market value of FAV/WR planted on base acres, beginning with FAV/WR with the highest market value per acre.

If the acreage for FAV/WR with the highest market value per acre is not sufficient to cover the acres in violation, then the payment reduction for the remaining acres shall be based on the market value of FAV/WR with the next highest market value per acre.

The planting violation payment reduction is calculated by multiplying the following:

- number of acres in violation, as determined in subparagraph C, times
- market value of FAV/WR planted on base acres, established according to subparagraph I, beginning with FAV/WR with the highest market value per acre.

31 FAV/WR Planting Violations (Continued)

**G Prorating Planting Violation**

Determine the planting violation for each covered commodity on the same farm by producer using this table.

Step	Action
1	Determine total direct payments for the farm by summing the result of the following calculation for each covered commodity on the farm. Multiply: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• payment acres minus acre-for-acre reduction, if applicable, times</li> <li>• yield, times</li> <li>• rate.</li> </ul>
2	Divide the planting violation for the farm (determined in subparagraph F) by the total direct payments for the farm (step 1). Round to 4 decimals.
3	For each covered commodity on the farm, multiply the result of step 2 times the direct payment for the subject commodity.
4	Multiply the result of step 3 times the producer's share or adjusted share (paragraph 62), if applicable, in the covered commodity. Round to nearest whole dollar.

**H Applying Planting Violation Payment Reduction**

Payment reductions for planting violations shall:

- be applied:
  - to both direct and counter-cyclical payments for the farm in violation
  - only to the DCP or ACRE payments for the year the violation occurred
- not be applied to:
  - other farms' DCP or ACRE payments
  - future year DCP or ACRE payments.

**Note:** Apply applicable payment limitation before making any payment reductions resulting from FAV/WR planting violations.

31 FAV/WR Planting Violations (Continued)

I Determining Market Value

STC shall establish a per acre market value for FAV/WR to be used for planting violation payment reduction calculations. This rate shall be based on the current-year market value per acre that producers in the State are expected to receive for FAV/WR. Rates for all crops, including perennial crops, shall be established without regard to the actual value realized by the producer in the current year.

**Example:** Grape vines are planted on base acres in violation of CCC-509. The per acre market value shall be based on the current year market value per acre that producers of grapes in the State are expected to receive, without regard to the production capability of the producer’s vines in the current year.

To assist STC in determining this value, STC may refer to:

- CSREES
- NASS
- other sources as determined by STC.

Thoroughly document all determinations in STC minutes.

**Note:** STC’s may elect to establish per acre market values for FAV/WR either:

- at the beginning of each year
- when requested by COC.

31 FAV/WR Planting Violations (Continued)

**J Example of Calculating Planting Violation**

Without a farm or producer history of planting FAV/WR, the producer planted 70 acres of FAV’s on a farm enrolled in DCP, of which 25 acres were planted on base acres. The double-cropping exception does not apply. This table provides the acreage of FAV’s planted on base acres and the applicable STC determined per acre market values.

FAV	Acres	Per Acre Market Value Set by STC
Carrots	10	\$650
Green Beans	30	\$600
Sweet Corn	30	\$400

This table provides the planting violation calculation, starting with carrots, FAV with the highest market value per acre.

FAV	Acres In Violation	Planting Violation Calculation
Carrots	10	10 acres in violation times \$650 per acre equals \$6,500.
Green Beans	15	15 acres in violation times \$600 per acre equals \$9,000.
Sweet Corn	0	

The 10 acres of carrots planted is not sufficient to cover the 25 acres in violation. Therefore, only 10 acres of the 25 acres of FAV’s planted on base acres will be assessed a planting violation payment reduction based on the market value of carrots. The payment reduction calculation for the remaining 15 acres in violation is based on the per acre market value of green beans. Sweet corn’s per acre market value is not used in the planting violation payment reduction calculation because it has the lowest market value per acre on the farm and the acreage for carrots and green beans was sufficient to cover the 25 acres in violation.



31 FAV/WR Planting Violations (Continued)

**J Example of Calculating Planting Violation (Continued)**

The farm’s \$15,500 (\$6,500 for carrots plus \$9,000 for green beans) planting violation is assessed after applying payment limitation. The planting violation will be prorated among covered commodities and producers on the farm sharing in DCP payments.

**Note:** In addition to the \$15,500 planting violation, an acre-for-acre reduction will be applied to the farm according to paragraph 22.

Prorate the \$15,500 planting violation among covered commodities on the farm according to the following steps.

**Step 1:** Determine total direct payment for the farm by multiplying the following for each covered commodity on the farm:

- payment acres minus acre-for-acre reduction, if applicable, times
- yield, times
- rate.

- \$15,500, planting violation for the farm, divided by
- \$21,061, direct payment for the farm, equals
- **.7360 factor.**

**K Reallocating Planting Violation**

Planting violation payment reductions may be re-allocated to other producers on the same farm if all affected parties agree in writing. However, if the payment reduction amount is not satisfied, payments to the other producers on the farm are subject to reduction. See paragraph 63.

## 32 FAV/WR Reporting Violations

### A Applicability

For DCP or ACRE, FAV/WR acreage reporting violation occurs when **both** of the following apply:

- FAV/WR is planted on base acres enrolled in DCP or ACRE
- FAV/WR determined acreage exceeds the reported acreage by more than the allowable tolerance provided in subparagraph B.

**Note:** See 2-CP for NAP provisions.

### B Tolerance

Tolerance is 5 percent of FAV/WR reported acreage, but shall not exceed 50 acres.

**Note:** Tolerance does not apply to FAV/WR planting violations under DCP or ACRE.

### C Calculating Tolerance

This table provides several examples of tolerance calculations for DCP or ACRE.

The reporting violation payment reduction is calculated by multiplying the following:

- the number of acres in violation (determined FAV/WR acreage minus FAV/WR reported acreage), times
- value per acre of the acre-for-acre reduction applied to the farm (subparagraph F), times
- 2.

**Note:** Apply payment limitation before making any producer payment reductions resulting from FAV/WR reporting violations.

**Important:** An acre-for-acre reduction in the DCP or ACRE payment acres is applied to the farm in addition to the reporting violation payment reduction. However, if a planting violation also exists on the same farm, the acre-for-acre reduction will only be applied once to the farm.

<b>Example:</b> Effective DCP Cropland	120

In this example, the FAV determined acreage exceeds the reported acreage by more than the allowable tolerance. Therefore, the following apply to the farm:

- reporting violation on 5 acres (determined FAV acreage minus reported FAV acreage)
- acre-for-acre reduction of 5 acres.

32 FAV/WR Reporting Violations (Continued)

**E Calculating Reporting Violation (Continued)**

In addition to the reporting violation, a planting violation exists on the farm. The farm has 20 free acres and plants 35 acres of FAV's. Farm and producer history do not exist for the farm. Therefore, the following apply to the farm:

- planting violation on 15 acres
- acre-for-acre reduction on 15 acres.

The acre-for-acre reduction shall only be applied to the farm 1 time. In this example, this farm would have an acre-for-acre reduction on 15 acres.

**F Manually Calculating Value of Acre-for-Acre Reduction**

FAV/WR reporting violation payment reductions are calculated based on the per acre value of the acre-for-acre reduction applied to the farm. The payment reduction software will calculate the value per acre of the acre-for-acre reduction. Manually calculate the value per acre of the acre-for-acre reduction according to this table.

Step	Action
1	For each covered commodity and peanuts with an acre-for-acre reduction, multiply the direct payment yield times the direct payment rate for the applicable covered commodity or peanuts to determine the value per acre.
2	Multiply the result of step 1, value per acre, times the acres to be reduced for the applicable covered commodity or peanuts to determine the value of the acre-for-acre reduction.
3	Add the result of step 2 for each covered commodity and peanuts with an acre-for-acre reduction to determine the value of the acre-for-acre reduction for the farm.
4	Divide the result of step 3 by the total payment acres to be reduced for the farm.

32 FAV/WR Reporting Violations (Continued)

**G Example of Calculating Value of Acre-for-Acre Reduction**

The following:

- example provides calculation for determining the value per acre of the acre-for-acre reduction for a farm that has 107 acres of FAV/WR planted on base acres enrolled in DCP
- table provides how the 107 acres to be reduced are applied to the covered commodities on the farm.

The Value of Acre-for-Acre Reduction column is determined by multiplying the value per acre times the acres to be reduced.

Determine the value per acre of the acre-for-acre reduction for the entire farm by dividing the total value of the acre-for-acre reduction for the farm by the total acres to be reduced for the farm.

**Example:** \$2,320, value of acre-for-acre reduction for the farm, divided by 107 acres to be reduced equals \$22.

32 FAV/WR Reporting Violations (Continued)

**H Example of Calculating Reporting Violation**

The reporting violation payment reduction for the example in subparagraph G is calculated by multiplying:

- 107, the number of acres in violation (determined acreage minus reported acreage), times
- \$22 value per acre of the acre-for-acre reduction applied to the farm (calculated in subparagraph G), times
- 2.

Therefore the reporting violation payment reduction for the farm is equal to \$4,708. The reporting violation is then prorated among covered commodities and peanuts on the farm that have an acre-for-acre reduction according to subparagraph I.

**K Adjust or Satisfy Reporting Violation**

A producer’s reporting violation payment reduction amount may be:

- satisfied in the FPR software (subparagraph 62 A)
- adjusted according to producer’s share of the reporting violation (subparagraph 61 A).

**33 DCP or ACRE Acreage Maintenance**

**A Maintenance Requirements**

Producers shall control the following on base acres enrolled in DCP or ACRE:

- wind and water erosion
- weeds, including noxious weeds.

**Note:** See 1-DCP (Rev. 3), paragraph 428.

**B Establishing Rates**

COC shall establish rates for calculating maintenance default payment reductions if the maintenance requirements provided in subparagraph A are not met. The rate shall represent the normal cost per acre in the county of the necessary action to correct the default. These established rates shall not be adjusted for individual producers.

**C Calculating Maintenance Payment Reductions**

If a maintenance default is determined according to this paragraph, a payment reduction is calculated by multiplying:

- acres in default, times
- COC established maintenance rate, times
- 3.

33 DCP or ACRE Acreage Maintenance (Continued)

**D First Default**

All producers sharing in DCP or ACRE payments on the farm are entitled to 1 warning letter for the first maintenance default.

The warning letter shall include the following:

- type of default
- date default was discovered
- number of acres in default
- action that is required to avoid a payment reduction
- when required action must be completed.

**Note:** If COC determines that only specific producers on the farm are responsible for the default, the warning letter shall be sent only to those producers.

33 DCP or ACRE Acreage Maintenance (Continued)

E Example of Warning Letter

This is a sample letter that may be used for the first weed control default.

A maintenance spot check conducted on (mm/dd/yy) on FSN (XXXX) revealed that weeds were not being controlled on 25.0 acres of base acres enrolled in DCP.

You have 15 calendar days to control the weeds in a manner that will ensure that the weed will not spread to other acreage. After 15 calendar days, a (XXXXXX) County Office representative will inspect the acreage in question and, if the necessary action has not being taken, direct payments on this farm will be reduced.

If you have any questions regarding this manner, please contact this office.

**Note:** Producers may request an extension if circumstances beyond their control prevent them from taking the necessary action in a timely manner.

**33 DCP or ACRE Acreage Maintenance (Continued)****F Second Default**

A second default applies when **both** of the following occur:

- maintenance requirements are not met
- producer has previously received a warning letter providing 15 calendar days to correct the default.

County Offices shall notify producers that have previously received a warning letter that a maintenance default payment reduction will be applied to their direct payment, but not to exceed 50 percent of the farm's total direct payments. Corrective action must be taken within 15 calendar days from the notification letter.

**Note:** Second default payment reductions only apply to direct payments.

**G Third Default**

A third default applies when **all** of the following occur:

- maintenance requirements are not met
- producer has previously received a:
  - warning letter providing 15 calendar days to correct the default
  - notification letter providing that a payment reduction will be applied to their direct payments, but not to exceed 50 percent of the farm's total direct payments (second default).

County Offices shall notify producers that have previously received a warning and notification letter of a previous default that a maintenance default payment reduction will be applied to their direct payment, but not to exceed 100 percent of the farm's total direct payments.

**Note:** Third default payment reductions only apply to direct payments.

**J Adjusting Maintenance Reduction Shares**

Payment reductions for maintenance defaults may be adjusted when either of the following occurs:

- a producer on the farm agrees to accept a larger share of the payment reduction and has sufficient direct earnings to cover the increased share of the maintenance default payment reduction
- COC determines that a specific producer or producers sharing in direct payments were responsible for the maintenance default.

**Note:** Payment reduction shall not exceed 50 percent of the farm's direct payment for the second default, or 100 percent for third and subsequent defaults.

34 CRP Maintenance Defaults

**A Types of Defaults**

The following are types of maintenance defaults that can occur on CRP acreage:

- unauthorized haying or grazing of an eligible cover
- noncontrol of weeds, insects, rodents, or wind or water erosion
- failure to maintain eligible cover.

**Note:** See 2-CRP, subparagraph 295 B for unauthorized planting or harvesting on CRP.

**B Examples of Defaults**

This table provides examples of maintenance defaults.

<b>Default Type</b>	<b>Example</b>
Unauthorized haying or grazing.	Harvesting hay or grazing livestock on CRP any time during the year.  <b>Note:</b> If all applicable forms for emergency haying or grazing are approved before the haying or grazing, then no maintenance default occurred.

The producer must do both of the following **before** COC can make a determination:

- submit an explanation for the default either in writing or in person
- correct the maintenance default as required by COC.

If COC:

- determines that a good faith effort was made to maintain CRP as required, a payment reduction will apply
- does not determine that a good faith effort was made, terminate CRP-1. Only the acres in violation shall be terminated.

**Notes:** The producer must provide a written explanation or request to meet with COC within 15 calendar days of the date of the notification letter.

COC shall:

- document the reasons for the determination in the minutes
- inform the producer of the right to appeal any decision made by COC according to 1-APP.

**35 Making Determinations****A Considerations Before Making Determinations**

The reviewing authority shall consider these guidelines when determining whether CCC-509 should be terminated.

- What was the degree of the violation?
  - How many acres of FAV/WR could be planted without a violation?
  - How many were planted on base acres enrolled in DCP?
- Should the producer have been reasonably expected to know there was a violation?
- Did the producer measure, or employ others to measure, the acreage?
- Was there reliance on photocopies or acreages of past determinations?
- Did the producer control, or could the producer have controlled, the factors contributing to the violation?
- Did the violation occur because of:
  - carelessness by the producer?
  - part of a scheme or device to avoid compliance?
- Were there extenuating circumstances that caused or contributed to the violation?

**35 Making Determinations (Continued)**

**B Authority for Planting Violation Determinations**

COC has the authority to determine, with STC concurrence, whether CCC-509 should be terminated when FAV/WR planting violation occurs.

**Note:** Tolerance does not apply to FAV/WR on farms with planting violations.

**C STC Authority**

STC:

- has the authority to make the determinations for those cases that exceed COC authority
- must concur with COC determinations made according to subparagraph B for DCP to be terminated.

**D Employees and Committee Members**

When STC's, COC's, or employees, including spouses and minor children, have an interest in a farm that is in violation, the next highest reviewing authority must determine whether CCC-509 should be terminated.

**E Documenting Determinations**

All COC or STC decisions, and reasons for those decisions, shall be documented in the applicable minutes.

**36 Producer Notifications****A Degree of Violation**

COC or STC, as applicable, may decide that the degree of the violation does not warrant terminating CCC-509 according to paragraph 35. In those cases, all affected producers shall be notified by letter of the following:

- CCC-509 is in violation, but COC or STC has determined not to terminate CCC-509
- the acre-for-acre reduction amount applied to the farm's DCP payments
- the planting violation payment reduction amount based on the per acre market value of FAV/WR planted on the base acres enrolled in DCP or ACRE
- the producer's appeal rights according to 1-APP.

**B Producer Notification**

In cases where it is determined that the degree of violation warrants terminating CCC-509, all affected producers shall be notified by letter of the following:

- CCC-509 is in violation and has been terminated
- reason for violation; that is, inaccurate report or planting violation
- appeal rights according to 1-APP.

- summarizes payment reductions for each producer by farm.

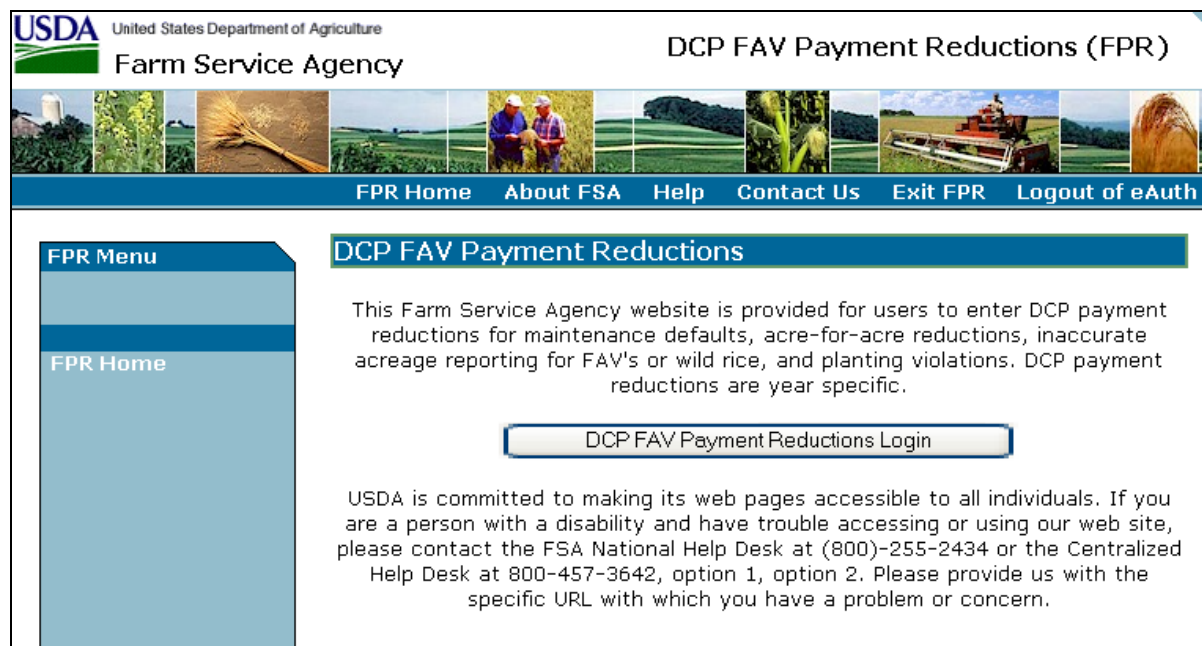

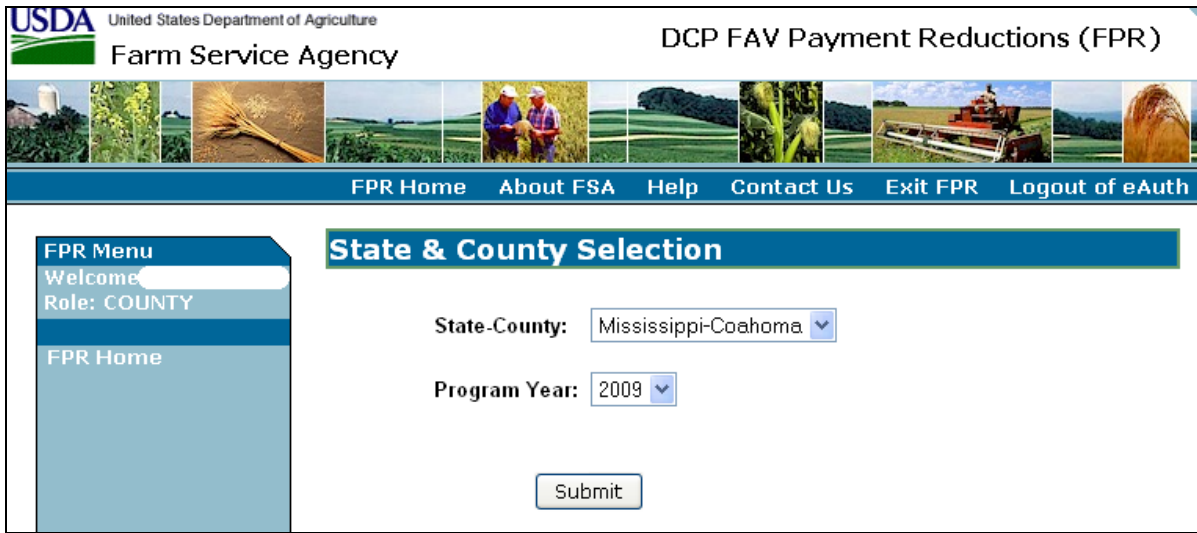

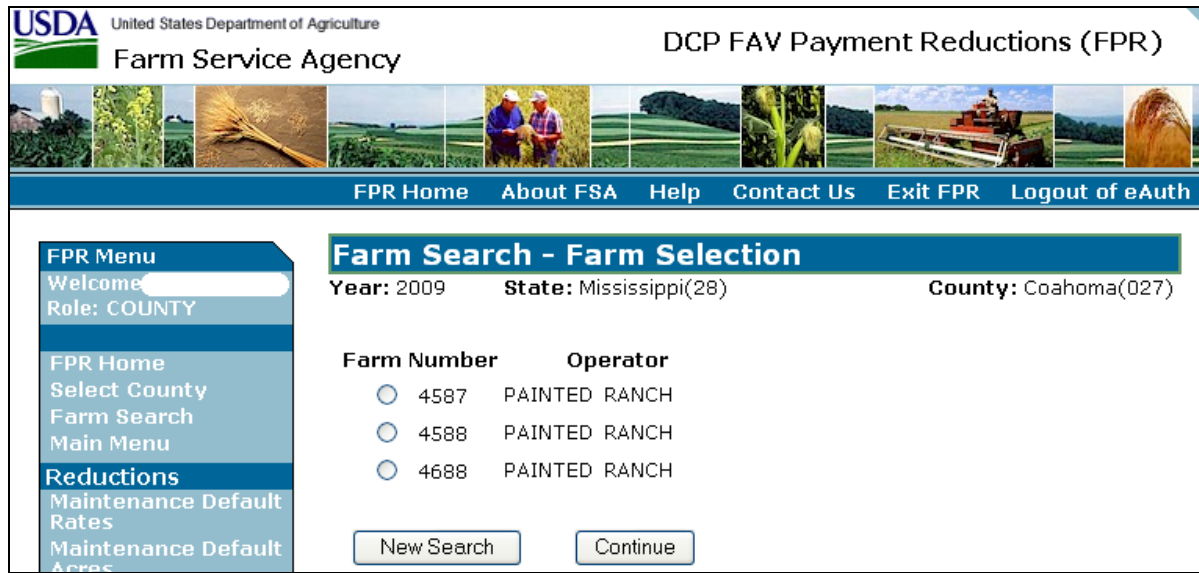

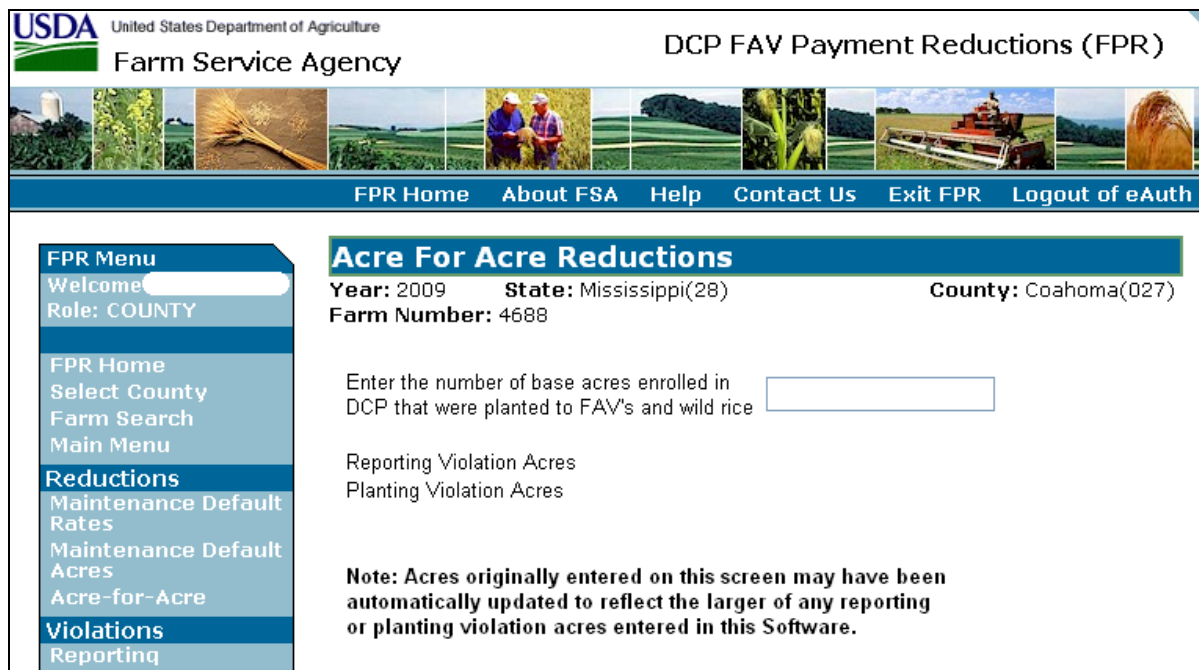

Planting violations are entered at the farm-level. In some situations, more than one FAV/WR is planted on a farm and, as a result, more than one FAV/WR causes a planting violation. In the event that multiple FAV's/WR cause a planting violation, the market value must be prorated to determine a farm-level amount to be entered in the "Planting Violation Value Per Acre" field on the Planting Violations Screen.

Determine the farm-level acres and market value according to the following.

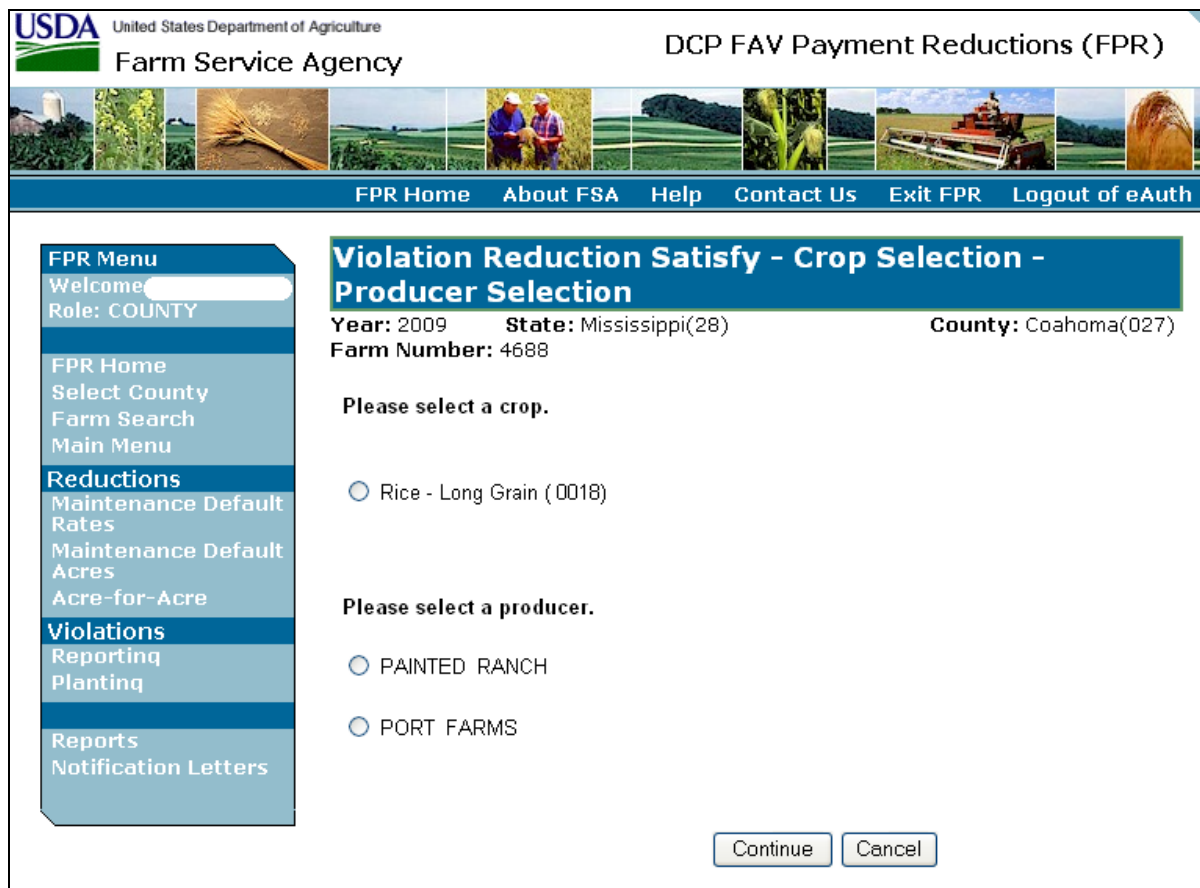

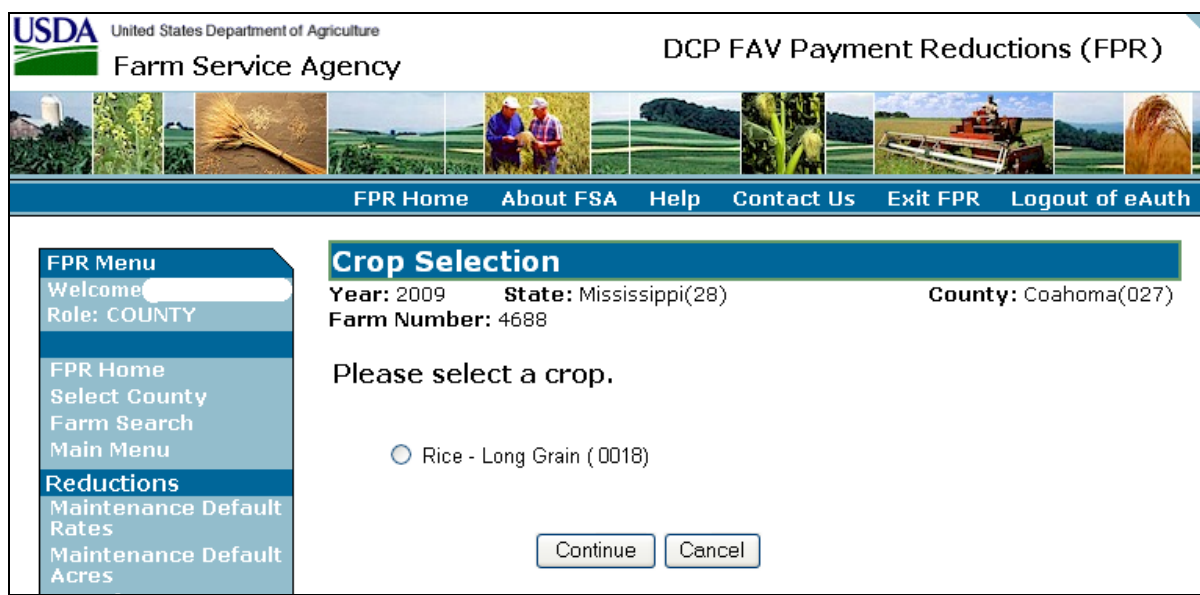

The "Free Acres (Nonbase Acres)" field on the FAV and WR Planted on Base Acres Report does not reflect crops planted by a producer with zero interest in CCC-509 that are considered planted on free acres. Therefore, County Offices shall manually revise the FAV and WR Planted on Base Acres Report according to subparagraph D.

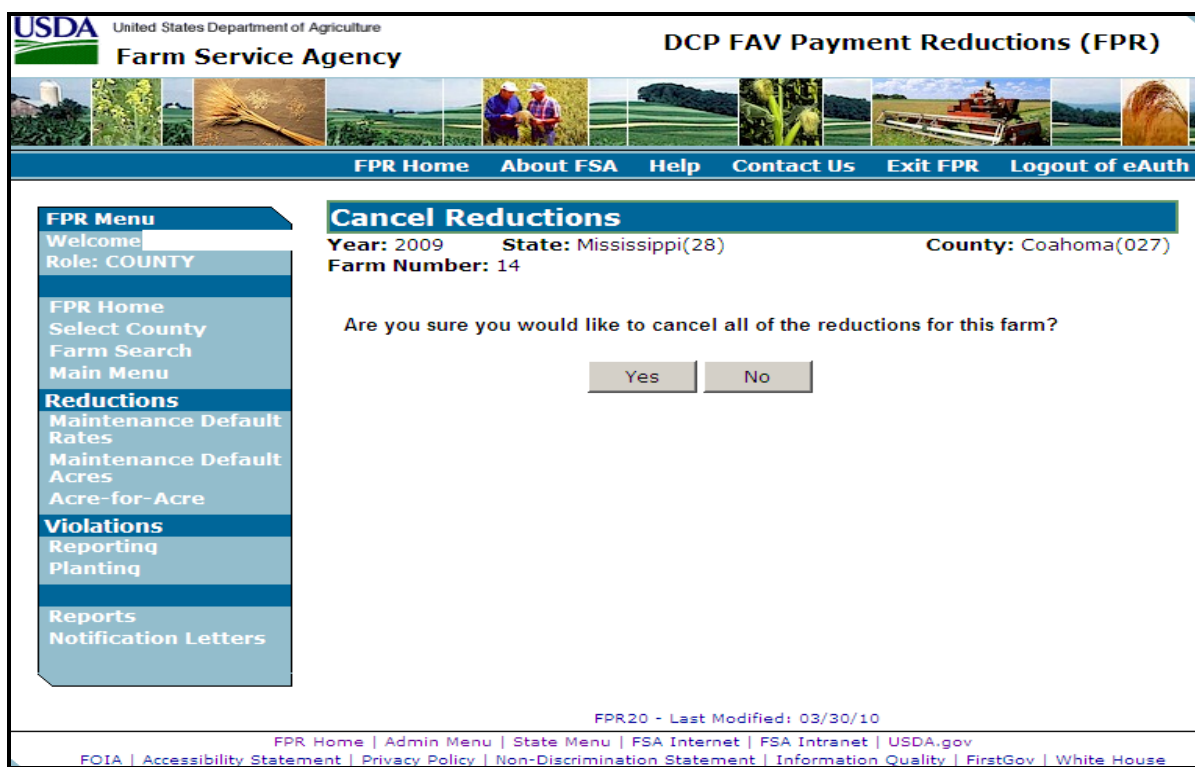

**A Cancel Reductions Screen**

FAV payment reduction software reads DCP-ACRE contract software to determine base acres, direct yields, shares, and producers. FAV payment reductions will be automatically cancelled if the DCP-ACRE contract is cancelled.

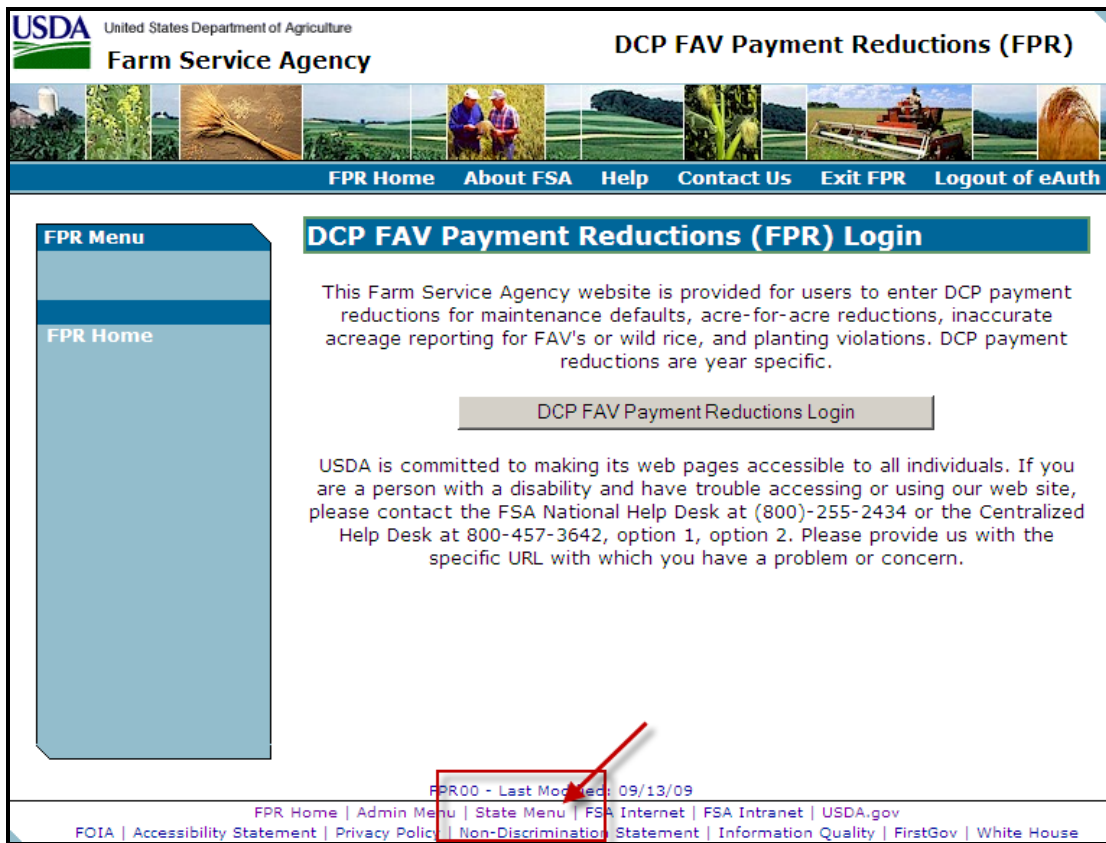

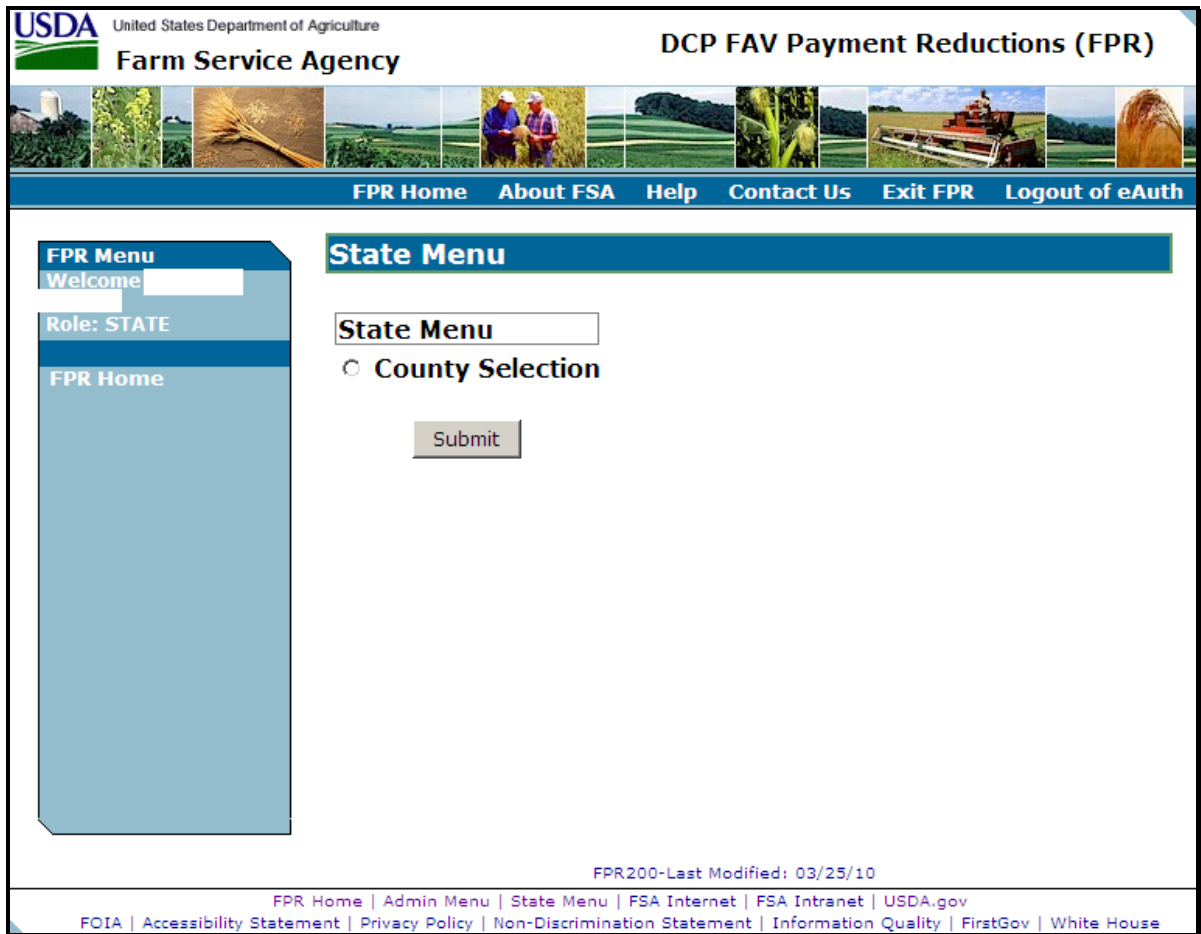

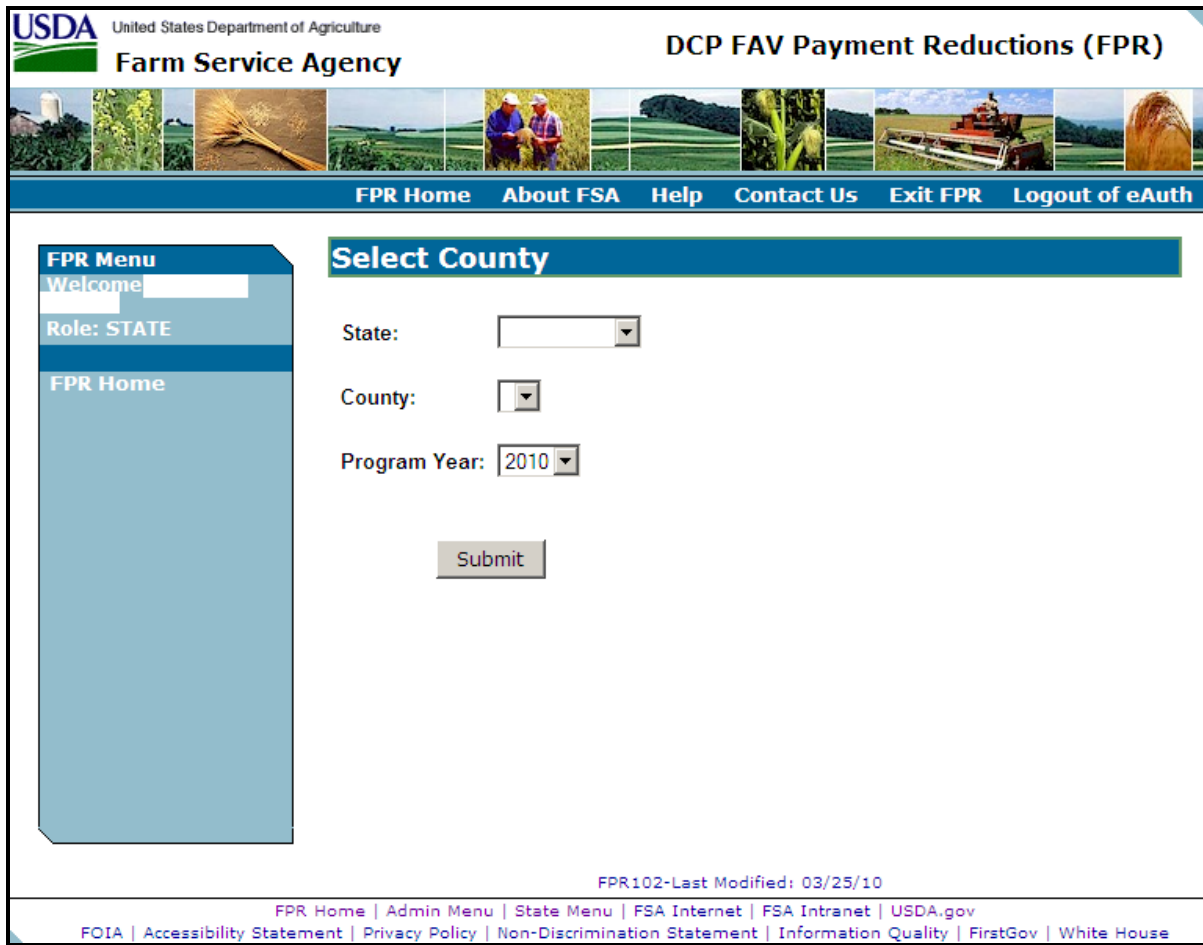

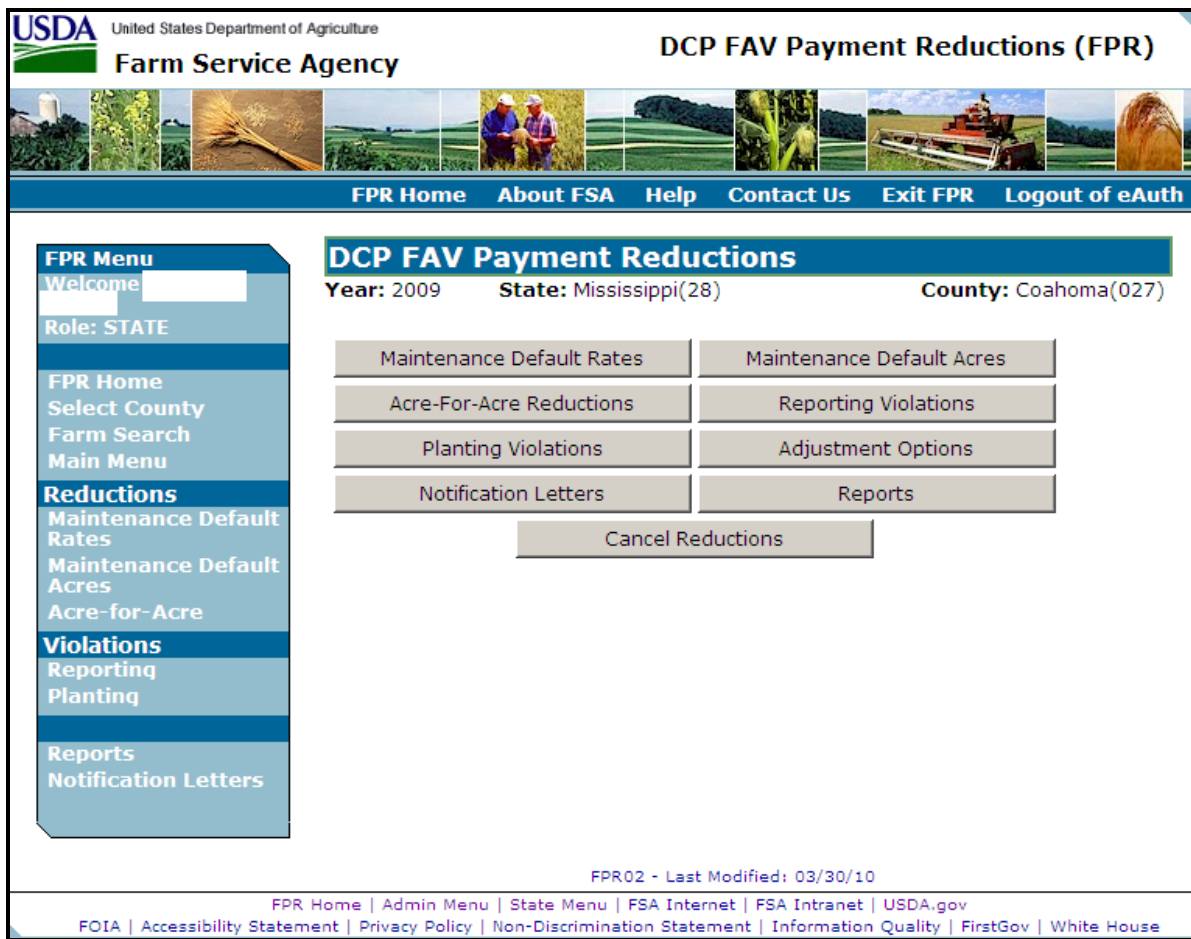

**Definitions of Terms Used in This Handbook**

**Acre-for-Acre Reduction**

Acre-for-acre reduction means a reduction of DCP payment acres when FAV/WR are planted on base acreage and payment acres are required to be reduced according to 1-DCP.

**Determined Acreage**

Determined acreage means acreage determined by an authorized FSA representative.

**Maintenance Default**

A maintenance default means base acreage enrolled in DCP is not maintained as required according to 1-DCP or CRP acreage is not maintained as required according to 2-CRP.

**Violation Reduction**

Violation reduction means reducing payments when CCC-509 is in violation, but the reviewing authority determines that the violation does not warrant terminating CCC-509.





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
