Executive Summary

One of North Dakota's greatest assets is its workforce. The 2011 North Dakota Workforce Review examines the workforce in an effort to better understand its characteristics and how they have changed over time. The first section looks at a statewide level then the workforce is broken into age and gender categories followed by a more in depth look at regional and county level data.

For the fifth consecutive year, the population of North Dakota increased over the previous year. The population has increased by approximately 7,875 people since 2009 and approximately 19,250 people since 2005. Overall, 47 of 53 counties in North Dakota experienced a population increase from 2009 to 2010.

Nearly half, approximately 48 percent, of North Dakota's population is comprised of individuals between the ages of 0 and 34 years. Nearly 19 percent of the population is between the ages of 0 and 14 years. Add that to the fact that approximately 67 percent of the population is between the ages of 15 and 64 years and it appears that North Dakota is comprised of mainly "working age" citizens and will have the capacity to replace the older workers who may choose to leave the workforce in the future.

From 2009 to 2010, the labor force of North Dakota increased by more than 1,500 and the average annual employment increased by more than 9,100. The growth in average annual employment outpacing the growth in labor force would indicate that there would be a lower percent of unemployed people in the state. From 2009 to 2010, that is exactly what happened. The unemployment rate dropped from 4.3 percent to 3.9 percent. Since 2002, North Dakota's labor force has grown by more than 24,000. Along the same vein, the average annual employment in North Dakota has risen by 46,866 over the same time period.

The unemployment rate in North Dakota fell from 2009 to 2010 from 4.3 percent to 3.9 percent, nearly a full 6 percentage points below the national rate of 9.6 percent. Add that to the fact that North Dakota's unemployment rate dropped to 3.9 percent while the national average increased from 9.3 to 9.6 percent and it appears that North Dakota's economy is growing while the rest of the nation continues to struggle through the worst economic downturn since the Great Depression.

Along with increases in population, labor force, and average annual employment, the average annual wage in North Dakota is growing as well. The average annual wage in North Dakota has increased by nearly \$13,500 since 2000 (nearly 55 percent) compared to more than \$11,400 (more than 32 percent) for the nation. While that still places North Dakota's annual average wage at less than the national average (\$38,127 compared to \$46,742 respectively) the gap is closing. From 2009 to 2010, the average annual wage in North Dakota increased by more than \$2,100 (nearly 6 percent) compared to less than \$1,200 for the nation (approximately 2.6 percent).

The state turnover rate fell by nearly a full percentage point to less than 8.5 percent from the previous year. The turnover rate, as defined by the Local Employment Dynamics program, includes the average of the number of new workers and the number leaving. This obtains a rate of job churning. For example, the definition of turnover rate used in this publication includes influences such as industrial effects (seasonality in construction) and geographic effects (wage competitiveness in the northwestern part of the state due to increased economic activity).

Population

According to the Census Bureau July 1 estimates, the population of North Dakota has increased by approximately 7,875 people from 2009 to 2010. This increase continues the trend established over the previous seven years (2003 to 2010) in which the population increased by approximately 22,098 people. There was a slight drop in population from 2004 to 2005 of more than 950 people, but that dip corrected itself in 2006 with an increase of nearly 1,500 people and has continued to increase ever since.

In 2007, the increase in population was concentrated in 13 counties. Ten of those 13 counties contained an urban center or was near the Bakken Oil Formation in western North Dakota. In 2008, three more counties experienced a population increase for a total of 16 counties. Six of those counties did not experience a population increase in 2007, but all 16 counties contained an urban center or were near the Bakken Formation. In 2009 four more counties experienced a population increase for a total of 20 counties. In 2010, 47 of the 53 counties experienced an increase in population. The only counties to experience a decrease in population were Nelson, Ransom, Billings, Sioux, Sargent, and Benson counties for a total decrease of slightly more than 500 individuals.


A review of North Dakota's population broken down into age brackets helps illustrate the number of current and possible future workers in North Dakota. Approximately 67 percent of the population falls into a combined bracket of 15-64 years, or "working age" individuals. In 2009, people aged 0-14 years old comprised 17.1 percent of the population; comparatively, in 2010, the same age bracket comprised 18.5 percent of the population. The percent of the population comprised of individuals 15-24 years of age decreased by approximately three percentage points, but every other "working age" age bracket experienced an increase in its percent of the population.

Population by Age 2009 (Figure 2)



Labor Force

The labor force of North Dakota continued the upward trend that started in 2002. Over the ten years from 2000 to 2010, North Dakota's labor force grew by more than 24,340. While the increase in the labor force coincided with the increase in population, the reverse is not true. As the population fell from 1999 to 2003, the labor force remained relatively steady. The labor force grew by 6.1 percent over the last seven years, as the population grew by 3.5 percent. A portion of the increase in the labor force from 2003 to 2010 can be attributed to the increase in population. However, other factors contributed to bolstering labor force levels as well.

One of the factors that contributed to bolstering labor force levels was the labor force participation rate. The labor force participation rate is the percent of civilian, non-institutionalized people over the age of 16 who are employed or are unemployed, but actively looking for a job in an economy.

Figure 4 compares the labor force participation rate of North Dakota to that of the United States. It illustrates that North Dakota has a higher labor force participation rate than the national average and that the gap between the two scores is widening. The national labor force participation rate has maintained a trend of declining or remaining steady for the last ten years. Despite a slight dip in North Dakota's labor force participation rate from 2008 to 2009, the labor force participation rate has rebounded and has, once again, increased from 2009 to 2010 to continue the overall trend of increasing since 2002.


One factor affecting the labor force participation rate is the increase in the population from 2009 to 2010 (almost 7,900) compared to the smaller increase (slightly more than 1,525) in the labor force. Since the labor force participation rate is a percent of the population, it is logical that the labor force participation rate would drop if the population growth outpaced the labor force growth by such a large margin. However, a large portion of the population increase from 2009 to 2010 was in the 0-14 year old age bracket. Those individuals are not considered when calculating the labor force participation rate since they are not over the age of 16. Thusly, despite total population increasing at a faster rate than the labor force, labor force participation rate can and has still increased from 2009 to 2010.

Figure 5 displays the unemployment rate for North Dakota and the United States. This graph shows that North Dakota is not isolated from national trends, but appears to be somewhat insulated from them. North Dakota appears to experience

Annual Labor Force Participation Rate (Figure 4)


Unemployment Rate (Figure 5)

the same peaks and troughs as the nation, but they are less extreme. North Dakota also lags behind the nation in the swings of the unemployment rate. These ideas are illustrated in the changes in the unemployment rate between 2000 and 2003 and again in the most recent economic downturn. The unemployment rate for 2010 represents a slight deviation from the previous trend of lagging behind the nation in the swings of unemployment rate. In 2010, the national unemployment rate continued to increase from 9.3 to 9.6 percent while the unemployment rate in North Dakota fell from 4.3 to 3.9 percent.




Figures 3, 5, and 6 are interrelated. Figure 6 shows North Dakota's annual average employment. This graph shows the same trend of slow growth from 2000 to 2002 with a steeper increase from 2002 to 2010 as Figure 3 indicates for North Dakota's labor force. The dip in average annual employment (Figure 6) for 2009 coincides with the increase in the unemployment rate for the same year (Figure 5). In 2009, the labor force continued to grow, but the number of employed individuals decreased. Those two factors combined to illustrate that the number of unemployed individuals increased which caused the unemployment rate to increase. Then, in 2010, when growth in average annual employment outpaced growth in the labor force, the number of unemployed individuals decreased and the unemployment rate fell.

Wages

Figure 7 displays the average annual wage for covered employment in North Dakota and the U.S. In 2007, North Dakota outpaced the nation in percent (5.7 percent to 4.5 percent, respectively), but due to the lower starting wage, the 5.7 percent increase resulted in an approximate \$1,770 increase for North Dakota compared to the \$1,923 increase for the nation. 2008 was the first year since 2003 that North Dakota outpaced the nation in both percent and total dollar increase in wages; 6.0 percent or \$1,989 in North Dakota compared to 2.5 percent or \$1,105 for the nation. That situation occurred again in 2009 when the national average annual wage dropped from

\$45,563 to \$45,551 (a decrease of approximately \$12) while the average annual wage in North Dakota continued to grow. The average annual wage in North Dakota increased by almost \$900 to nearly \$36,000. The increase in annual average wage in North Dakota outpaced the nation in percent and total dollar again in 2010. The average annual wage in North Dakota grew by 6 percent to more than \$38,125 compared to 2.6 percent growth for the nation to nearly \$46,750.

Over the past ten years, the average annual wage in North Dakota increased \$13,444 (54.5 percent). Comparatively, the average annual wage for the nation increased \$11,419 (32.3 percent). In 2007, the average annual wage in North Dakota was approximately 74 percent of the nation's average annual wage. That percent increased to nearly 77 percent in 2008, nearly 79 percent in 2009, and nearly 82 percent in 2010.

U.S. Annual Average Wage for 2010 is a preliminary figure and is subject to change.

Occupations

Occupation categories start at a broad level of description and grow increasingly more specific. Table 1 shows data for the top ten of the 22 broadest occupational groups based on the estimated employment in 2008. The column on the left shows the employment in 2008, the column in the middle shows the projected employment levels in 2018, and the column on the right shows the percent change from 2008 to 2018, also known as the growth rate. The growth rate for the state as a whole is projected to be 9.2 percent or increase from approximately 420,109 total employment in 2008 to approximately 458,634 in 2018.

Industry

Table 1 show data for occupations (e.g. bricklayer) while the following tables show data for the industry level (e.g. construction). The occupation is the type of work performed by an individual while the industry is the primary type of work an organization performs. Table 2 shows data for North Dakota's top ten industries based on average weekly wage for 2010 as well as the average weekly wage in 2000. The top ten industries are the same for both years, but the order has shifted over time. Mining has been bolstered by oil and gas activity in the Bakken Formation in western North Dakota, but has historically remained high because of coal mining in the state. Mining has seen a nearly 80 percent increase in average weekly wage over the last ten years. The utilities industry has experienced consistently high wages because of high-paying jobs in the power plants across the state. In 2007, utilities maintained the highest average weekly wage of all industries in North Dakota before it was overtaken in 2008 by mining. Utilities was once again the top spot in 2009 with an average weekly wage of \$1,437, but was again passed by mining in 2010 with an average weekly wage of \$1,538.

Table 3 shows the ten largest industries in North Dakota by the number of people employed in that industry in 2010 as well as the employment numbers and rank for that industry in 2000. The largest industry, in terms of employment, is health care and social assistance with employment of 55,598 in 2010. That number equates to more than a 20 percent increase over ten years. Health care and social assistance and retail trade have been the two largest industries in terms of employment since 1990. Retail trade was the largest employer from 1990 to 1993 when it was overtaken by health care and social assistance and has remained in the second spot ever since.

Educational Attainment

Table 5 shows the number of program completers at North Dakota public and private institutions. Some students graduate having completed multiple programs. Rather than counting the number of students who graduate by their primary degree, this table counts a student, who graduates after completing multiple programs, by each of the programs they complete. For example, if a student graduates after completing the business program and the education program, the student is counted in each program. This provides a better description of the skill sets of graduates than counting the previous example as one student in the business field of study. The table is further broken down by the type of institution attended and the student's year of graduation.






Percent of Total Jobs Worked






Percent of Total Jobs Worked



Percentage of Jobs by Age and Gender












2010 Population by Age




2010 Population by Age


2010 Population by Age


