

Our Spanish class is offering something different, but fun for Galer students grades K-2:

Kindergarten is learning to identify parts of the face

First grade is learning to write complete sentences associating objects and animals with their locations.

Second grade is learning the names of the rooms in the house.

Reuse in Ms. C and Mr. M's Prek Classroom

we entered the study "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle" we started things off with the concept of trash. Once that was established, we began to explore and question how trash could be <u>reused</u>. We took a closer look at boxes and the children discovered that empty boxes could be used to build towers. They also decided that they could be painted. Many empty food boxes were laid out on the table with a variety of colors of paint.

The project started out as a community project so the children moved freely around the table, adding paint to which ever box took their fancy.







Over the course of about a week, the children had the opportunity to return and add further layers of paint. They experimented with different types of painting tools and explored painting the inside, as well as the outside of the boxes.











Once they were dry, the children added their choice of colorful shape buttons.
