Falcon Battalion



The Fort Campbell High School JROTC Drill team won the title of overall drill champion Oct. 6, at the North Bullitt High School Drill competition in Shepardsville, Ky. Most notably, the Fort Campbell JROTC Falcons won three first-place trophies in the drill categories of Color Guard - freshmen, Color Guard - female, and Armed exhibition.





FCHS JROTC Raider team dominated the wins at the Paducah -Tilghman High School. The Sports Challenge on Saturday September 15th, at Paducah, KY, was comprised of ten teams from Army, Navy, and Air Force JROTC programs from the Kentucky region. Most notably, the Fort Campbell JROTC Falcons won 1st in the one mile relay and 50 meter race and 2nd in the Physical Fitness Endurance test. A total of nine, 1st,2nd,3rd place trophies were awarded to the Fort Campbell Falcons. The team captain for this event was JROTC Cadet Lieutenant James Cusic.
