Virginia L. Lempesis (Wilson Ranch) Adjustment and Settlement of Certain Claimed Water Rights Contract

Background: The Wilson Ranch consists of approximately 223 acres located on the Fresno Slough, adjacent to the Mendota Pool. The Wilson family, owners of the property, have asserted and exercised water rights to water in the Mendota Pool for over 70 years at the same point of diversion. The current owner is Virginia Lempesis trustee of the Virginia Lempesis Separate Property Trust. The property has historically been planted to row crops each year, and that pattern continues today.

<u>Purpose and Need for Action</u>: The purpose of the proposed action is to enter into a water rights settlement contract in order to quantify the amount of water that may be diverted from the Mendota Pool under the rights claimed by the property owner.

<u>Proposed Action</u>: Reclamation proposes entering into a contract for the adjustment and settlement of a claimed water right with the property owner for up to 600 acre-feet per year that would be managed similarly as other Settlement Contracts on the Mendota Pool. Both the point of diversion and means of diversion will be unchanged under the proposed contract. There would be no change in cropping patterns, no new land brought into production, no new facilities installed, and no other physical changes on the property or elsewhere as a result of the proposed contract. Under the proposed contract, the amount of water diverted would be measured and reported, and the amount of water diverted may be somewhat decreased from the historical average.

The property is located in Sections 32 and 33, Township 14 South, Range 16 East, and Sections 4 and 5, Township 15 South, Range 16 East, Mount Diablo Base and Meridian.
