A BILL

To abolish the Export-Import Bank of the United States, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Export-Import Bank

5 Termination Act of 2012".

6 SEC. 2. REDUCTIONS OF AUTHORITIES BEFORE ABOLISH-

7 **MENT.**

8 Notwithstanding any other provision of law:

9 (1) TERMINATION OF AUTHORITY TO ACCEPT
10 APPLICATIONS FOR ASSISTANCE.—The Export-Im-

1	port Bank of the United States (in this Act referred
2	to as the "Bank") may not accept an application for
3	a loan, insurance, or a guarantee, or to participate
4	in an extension of credit by another entity, after the
5	30-day period that begins with the date of the enact-
6	ment of this Act.
7	(2) TERMINATION OF AUTHORITY TO RENEW
8	OR ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR THE PROVISION
9	OF ASSISTANCE BY THE BANK.—The Bank may not
10	renew or enter into a contract which would obligate
11	the Bank to provide a loan, insurance, or a guar-
12	antee, or participate in an extension of credit by an-
13	other entity, after the 12-month period that begins
13 14	other entity, after the 12-month period that begins with such date of enactment.

14 15	with such date of enactment. SEC. 3. ABOLISHMENT OF EXPORT-IMPORT BANK OF THE
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of the Treasury (in this Act referred to as the "Sec retary").

3 (b) ABOLISHMENT DATE DEFINED.—In this Act, the
4 term "abolishment date" means the date that is 3 years
5 after the date of the enactment of this Act.

6 SEC. 4. RESOLUTION AND TERMINATION OF BANK FUNC7 TIONS.

8 (a) RESOLUTION OF FUNCTIONS.—The Secretary9 shall—

10 (1) complete the disposition and resolution of
11 functions of the Bank in accordance with this Act;
12 and

13 (2) resolve all functions that are transferred to14 the Secretary under section 3(a)(2).

(b) TERMINATION OF FUNCTIONS.—All functions
that are transferred to the Secretary under section 3(a)(2)
shall terminate on the date all obligations of the Bank,
and all obligations of others to the Bank, in effect immediately before the abolishment date have been satisfied, as
determined by the Secretary.

(c) REPORT TO THE CONGRESS.—When the Secretary makes the determination described in subsection
(b), the Secretary shall report the determination to the
Committee on Financial Services of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Finance of the Senate.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall be responsible
3 for the implementation of this Act, including—

4 (1) the administration and wind-up of all func5 tions transferred to the Secretary under section
6 3(a)(2);

7 (2) the administration and wind-up of any out8 standing obligations of the Federal Government
9 under any programs terminated by this Act; and

10 (3) taking such other actions as may be nec11 essary to wind-up any outstanding affairs of the
12 Bank.

13 (b) DELEGATION OF FUNCTIONS.—The Secretary may delegate to any other Federal department or agency 14 head the performance of the functions of the Secretary 15 16 under this Act, to the extent that the Secretary determines that the delegation would further the purposes of this Act. 17 18 (c) TRANSFER OF ASSETS AND PERSONNEL.—In 19 connection with any delegation of functions under sub-20 section (b), the Secretary may transfer to the department 21 or agency concerned such assets, funds, personnel, 22 records, and other property relating to the delegated func-23 tion as the Secretary determines to be appropriate.

24 (d) AUTHORITIES OF THE SECRETARY.—For pur-25 poses of performing the functions of the Secretary under

this Act and subject to the availability of appropriations,
 the Secretary may—

- 3 (1) enter into contracts;
- 4 (2) employ experts and consultants in accord5 ance with section 3109 of title 5, United States
 6 Code, at rates for individuals not to exceed the per
 7 diem rate equivalent to the rate for level IV of the
 8 Executive Schedule; and
- 9 (3) utilize, on a reimbursable basis, the services,
 10 facilities, and personnel of other Federal agencies.

11 SEC. 6. PERSONNEL.

12 Effective on the abolishment date, there are trans-13 ferred to the Department of the Treasury all individuals, 14 other than members of the Board of Directors of the 15 Bank, who—

- 16 (1) immediately before the abolishment date,17 were officers or employees of the Bank; and
- (2) in their capacity as such an officer or employee, performed functions that are transferred to
 the Secretary under section 3(a)(2).

21 SEC. 7. TRANSFER OF INSPECTOR GENERAL DUTIES.

(a) TERMINATION OF THE OFFICE OF INSPECTOR
GENERAL FOR THE EXPORT-IMPORT BANK OF THE
UNITED STATES.—Notwithstanding any other provision
of law, the Office of Inspector General for the Bank shall

terminate on the abolishment date, and the assets and ob ligations of the Office shall be transferred to the Office
 of the Inspector General for the Department of the Treas ury or otherwise disposed of.

5 (b) AUTHORITY AND RESPONSIBILITY FOR TRANS6 FER OR DISPOSAL.—The Secretary shall have the author7 ity and responsibility for transfer or disposal under sub8 section (a).

9 (c) SAVINGS PROVISION.—The provisions of this sec-10 tion shall not affect the performance of any pending audit, investigation, inspection, or report by the Office of the In-11 spector General for the Bank as of the abolishment date, 12 13 with respect to functions transferred by this section. Nothing in this subsection shall be deemed to prohibit the dis-14 15 continuance or modification of any performance under the same terms and conditions and to the same extent that 16 17 such performance could have been discontinued or modi-18 fied if this section had not been enacted.

19 SEC. 8. EXERCISE OF AUTHORITIES.

Except as otherwise provided by law, a Federal official to whom a function is transferred by this Act may, for purposes of performing the function, exercise all authorities under any other provision of law that were available with respect to the performance of that function to the official responsible for the performance of the function immediately before the effective date of the transfer of the
 function under this Act.

3 SEC. 9. TRANSFER OF ASSETS.

4 Except as otherwise provided in this Act, so much 5 of the personnel, property, records, and unexpended balances of appropriations, allocations, and other funds em-6 7 ployed, used, held, available, or to be made available in 8 connection with a function transferred to an official or 9 agency by this Act shall be available to the official or the 10 head of that agency, respectively, at such time or times as the Director of the Office of Management and Budget 11 12 directs for use in connection with the functions transferred. 13

14 SEC. 10. DELEGATION AND ASSIGNMENT.

15 Except as otherwise expressly prohibited by law, an official to whom functions are transferred under this Act 16 17 (including the head of any office to which functions are transferred under this Act) may delegate any of the func-18 tions so transferred to such officers and employees of the 19 20 office of the official as the official may designate, and may 21 authorize successive redelegations of such functions as 22 may be necessary or appropriate. No delegation of func-23 tions under this section or under any other provision of 24 this Act shall relieve the official to whom a function is transferred under this Act of responsibility for the admin istration of the function.

3 SEC. 11. AUTHORITY OF THE SECRETARY OF THE TREAS4 URY WITH RESPECT TO FUNCTIONS TRANS5 FERRED.

6 (a) DETERMINATIONS.—If necessary, the Secretary
7 shall make any determination of the functions that are
8 transferred under this Act.

9 (b) INCIDENTAL TRANSFERS.—The Secretary, at 10 such time or times as the Secretary shall provide, may make such determinations as may be necessary with re-11 12 gard to the functions transferred by this Act, and to make 13 such additional incidental dispositions of personnel, assets, liabilities, grants, contracts, property, records, and unex-14 15 pended balances of appropriations, authorizations, allocations, and other funds held, used, arising from, available 16 17 to, or to be made available in connection with such functions, as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of 18 19 this Act.

20 SEC. 12. SAVINGS PROVISIONS.

(a) LEGAL DOCUMENTS.—All orders, determinations,
rules, regulations, permits, grants, loans, contracts, agreements, certificates, licenses, and privileges—

(1) that have been issued, made, granted, or al-lowed to become effective by the President, the

Bank, any officer or employee of any office trans ferred by this Act, or any other Government official,
 or by a court of competent jurisdiction, in the per formance of any function that is transferred by this
 Act, and

6 (2) that are in effect on the effective date of the
7 transfer (or become effective after such date pursu8 ant to their terms as in effect on such effective
9 date),

10 shall continue in effect according to their terms until
11 modified, terminated, superseded, set aside, or revoked in
12 accordance with law by the President, any other author13 ized official, a court of competent jurisdiction, or operation
14 of law.

15 (b) PROCEEDINGS.—This Act shall not affect any proceedings or any application for any benefits, service, 16 license, permit, certificate, or financial assistance pending 17 18 on the date of the enactment of this Act before an office transferred by this Act, but such proceedings and applica-19 tions shall be continued. Orders shall be issued in such 20 21 proceedings, appeals shall be taken therefrom, and pay-22 ments shall be made pursuant to such orders, as if this 23 Act had not been enacted, and orders issued in any such 24 proceeding shall continue in effect until modified, termi-25 nated, superseded, or revoked by a duly authorized official,

by a court of competent jurisdiction, or by operation of
 law. Nothing in this subsection shall be considered to pro hibit the discontinuance or modification of any such pro ceeding under the same terms and conditions and to the
 same extent that such proceeding could have been discon tinued or modified if this Act had not been enacted.

7 (c) SUITS.—This Act shall not affect suits com8 menced before the date of the enactment of this Act, and
9 in all such suits, proceeding shall be had, appeals taken,
10 and judgments rendered in the same manner and with the
11 same effect as if this Act had not been enacted.

(d) NONABATEMENT OF ACTIONS.—No suit, action,
or other proceeding commenced by or against an office
transferred by this Act, or by or against any individual
in the official capacity of such individual as an officer or
employee of such an office, shall abate by reason of the
enactment of this Act.

(e) CONTINUANCE OF SUITS.—If any Government officer in the official capacity of such officer is party to a
suit with respect to a function of the officer, and under
this Act such function is transferred to any other officer
or office, then such suit shall be continued with the other
officer or the head of such other office, as applicable, substituted or added as a party.

1 (f) Administrative Procedure and Judicial Re-2 VIEW.—Except as otherwise provided by this Act, any 3 statutory requirements relating to notice, hearings, action 4 upon the record, or administrative or judicial review that 5 apply to any function transferred by this Act shall apply to the exercise of such function by the head of the Federal 6 7 agency, and other officers of the agency, to which such 8 function is transferred by this Act.

9 SEC. 13. AVAILABILITY OF EXISTING FUNDS.

Existing appropriations and funds available for the performance of functions, programs, and activities terminated pursuant to this Act shall remain available, for the duration of their period of availability, for necessary expenses in connection with the termination and resolution of such functions, programs, and activities.

16 SEC. 14. CONFORMING AMENDMENTS AND REPEALS.

(d) ELIMINATION OF OFFICE OF INSPECTOR GEN ERAL FOR THE BANK.—Section 12 of the Inspector Gen eral Act of 1978 (5 U.S.C. App.) is amended—

4 (1) in paragraph (1), by striking "the President
5 of the Export-Import Bank;"; and

6 (2) in paragraph (2), by striking "the Export7 Import Bank,".

8 (e) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The repeals and amend9 ments made by this section shall take effect on the abolish10 ment date.

11 (f) Report to the Congress on Other Amend-MENTS TO FEDERAL STATUTE.—The Secretary shall sub-12 mit to the Committee on Financial Services of the House 13 of Representatives and the Committee on Banking, Hous-14 15 ing, and Urban Affairs of the Senate a written report that contains suggestions for such other amendments to Fed-16 17 eral statutes as may be necessary or appropriate as a re-18 sult of this Act.

19 SEC. 15. REFERENCES.

Any reference in any other Federal law, Executive
order, rule, regulation, or delegation of authority, or any
document of or pertaining to a department or office from
which a function is transferred by this Act—

1 (1) to the head of such department or office is 2 deemed to refer to the head of the department or of-3 fice to which the function is transferred; or 4 (2) to such department or office is deemed to 5 refer to the department or office to which the func-6 tion is transferred. 7 SEC. 16. DEFINITIONS. 8 In this Act: (1) FUNCTION.—The term "function" includes 9 any duty, obligation, power, authority, responsibility, 10 11 right, privilege, activity, or program. (2) OFFICE.—The term "office" includes any 12 13 office, administration, agency, bureau, institute, 14 council, unit, organizational entity, or component thereof. 15

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
