Security Assessment for Enforcement (SAFE) Checklist

When assessing unusual activities within the trucking industry, ask yourself: Who, what, when, where, and why?

Who: Driver - Is the driver present? Can he provide:

- Proper commercial drivers licence?
- If truck is rented: Is the driver authorized to operate the vehicle as shown on the lease agreement?
- If truck is placarded:

Does the driver have the proper shipping papers? Does the driver have the proper emergency response contact number(s)?

- What: Cargo Is the cargo suspicious?
 - Is it hazardous material?
 - Is it placarded?
 - Is it identified by a shippers name?
 - Is it identified by a DOT number?
 - Is it a rental vehicle?

	 When: Time - Is it unusual to see a truck: after normal business hours; in the middle of the night; when the business or institution is closed; or if the vehicle is seen at a time when deliveries are not normally accepted? Where: Location - Is it unusual for a truck to be parked near:

 Why: Route - Does the truck seem out of place: Is it off the interstate in area where it does not belong? Is there another vehicle parked near the truck? Is the truck in a highly populated or volatile area?
