Dear Parents,

During the week of February 25- March 1, 2013, Terra Nova testing battery will be administered to students in grades 3 through 11 grades. The content of the test is designed to measure concepts, processes, and objectives taught throughout the nation. Testing begins on Monday, February 25 and will end March 1 during the mornings. Please ensure that your child is in school. Please schedule appointments after lunch if not, after school.

The complete battery provides measurement of student achievement in Reading, Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies. Our English language learner 1 and 2 will take an alternate assessment; the Plus component adds to Math Computation and the IPT.

You are probably wondering how you can help your child prepare for the upcoming tests. These are ways to help prepare your child:

- Be sure your child comes to school each day well rested and on time.
- Reinforce the idea that testing is just another part of their school experience and reduce any anxiety they may have.
- Share with him/her that the purpose of the test is to find out which skills have been mastered and which skills need further development.
- There is no material to study. The only materials needed are two sharpened # 2 pencils with good erasers and a good book to read for the in between times.

My hope is that this assessment experience will enable teachers to use the test results to meet the everevolving needs of our students. The aggregate results will help the administration make good curricular and instructional choices. Thank you for your continued support and cooperation.

Ramey School Needs Your Support

Each quarter Ramey School analyzes student attendance and tardiness. Research consistently shows a strong relationship between student attendance and academic performance, confirming what we already know about student learning. What is surprising is the poor attendance rate among Ramey students. During the 1st semester 3,478 instructional days were lost due to "excused" and "unexcused" absences. Poor absenteeism is not something affecting a few students. In fact, 158 students met the definition of being "chronically absent" – missing at least 10% of the school year. This translates to 1 out of every 3 students at Ramey! Chronic absenteeism is associated with lower academic achievement as well as gaps in achievement. Attendance rates at Ramey School must improve and doing so will require your cooperation.

Upon my arrival to Ramey School I addressed parents about my simple philosophy regarding education and student performance – "Excellence is our only option." Being excellent means putting forth effort and being well disciplined, in our thoughts and actions. Excellence happens when people work together for a common purpose. We cannot provide your child an excellent education if they are not at school. Your help is required.

Your child's attendance will be carefully monitored throughout the remainder of the year. The school will be in contact with sponsors and parents whose children remain or become chronically absent from Ramey. Appropriate actions will be taken and may result in the following consequences:

- Sponsor/Parent meeting with the school
- Student referral to the student study team (SST)
- Loss of class or course credit for the semester
- When appropriate, a request to the base commander for assistance

Once again, please help us provide your child with an excellent education by making sure they are attending school. Thank you in advance for your assistance concerning this important issue. Any questions or concerns about the school attendance policy can be directed to my office.

ALERT: Stray Textbooks Roaming on Campus

Every secondary student (6th-12th grade) is assigned a locker to store academic materials and personal belongings. The storage of these materials keeps them safe and ensures our campus stays organized and clutter free. Lately, students have been placing textbooks, personal items, and trash on top of the lockers. Often times these items are left outside overnight exposed to the weather. This causes damage to expensive textbooks that are purchased with the intent of lasting five to ten years.

Beginning 2nd semester Ramey School will be addressing this issue. Secondary students will be required at all times to store textbooks and personal items in assigned lockers. Any items left outside during the day or night will be confiscated. Textbooks found outside will be stored in the main office, whereas personal items will be sent to lostand-found located in the cafeteria. Students will be assigned a lunch detention for school materials left on or near a locker. Sponsors may be financially responsible for textbooks or school materials sustaining significant damage. Early Release Day February 14, 2013




There has been a change in the Early Release Date for the month of February.

PREKINDER INVESTIGATION: Clothes Study




