## WIRELESS TELECOMMUNICATIONS BUREAU SEEKS COMMENT ON QUALCOMM INCORPORATED'S PETITION FOR DECLARATORY RULING SEEKING 700 MHZ BAND LICENSE PURSUANT TO RULING OF U.S CIRCUIT COURT OF APPEALS

QUALCOMM Incorporated ("QUALCOMM") has filed a Petition for Declaratory Ruling<sup>1</sup> pursuant to Section 1.2 of the Rules and Regulations of the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC" or "Commission").<sup>2</sup> QUALCOMM seeks to withdraw its pending pioneer's preference request for the A Block broadband PCS license in the Southern Florida Major Trading Area and substitute for it the 700 MHz band D Block license (752-762 MHz and 782-792 MHz) in the Southeast Economic Area Grouping 3 ("EAG 3").<sup>3</sup>

QUALCOMM contends that the 700 MHz band D Block license is the only immediately available license that will satisfy the mandate of the Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia. Circuit.<sup>4</sup> QUALCOMM submits estimates of spectrum value to support its contention.

This proceeding has been designated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.<sup>5</sup> Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentations must contain summaries of the substance of the presentations and not merely a listing of the subjects discussed.
