FORT HOOD FACTS

**SUPPLEMENTATION.** Local supplementation of this regulation is prohibited except upon approval of AFZF-RM.

**SUGGESTED IMPROVEMENTS.** The proponent of this regulation is the Directorate of Resource Management (DRM). Users are invited to send comments and suggested improvements to Commander, III Corps and Fort Hood, ATTN: AFZF-RM-M, Fort Hood, Texas.

OVERVIEW 1

**Purpose** This regulation sets up policy, procedures, and responsibilities for compiling, reporting, consolidating and publishing Fort Hood facts. 1a

**Applicability** This regulation applies to all III Corps and Fort Hood staff sections and activities. Each staff section and activity will compile and report statistics as designated in appendix A. 1b

RESPONSIBILITIES 2

**DRM** The DRM

- consolidates statistical reports from appropriate staff activities
- applies formulas necessary for estimating population
- prepares the statistics for reproduction by DOIM ASD
- makes distribution of the Fort Hood facts card, and
- maintains permanent files of statistical data for future reference. 2a

**Staff Sections and Activities** III Corps and Fort Hood staff sections and activities compile and report monthly and quarterly statistics as designated in appendix A. 2b

**1st Cavalry Division (1CD), 2d Armored Division (2AD), and 13th SUPCOM** 1CD, 2AD, and 13th SUPCOM provide data to the III Corps finance and accounting officer concerning military pay statistics no later than the second workday following receipt of JUMPS-ARMY Status Report, CSC FA 292, from the U.S. Army Finance Center. 2c

POLICY 3

**Fact Card Use** The quarterly Fort Hood facts card

- serves as a ready reference for statistical data when
  - briefing official visitors
  - answering inquiries concerning Fort Hood's economic impact on surrounding communities.
- usefulness is dependent upon accurate and timely compilation, reporting, and publication of current data. 3a

PROCEDURES

Data Submission

Monthly statistics (other than military pay) will be provided

- to DRM, ATTN: AFZF-RM-M
- by the 10th calendar day of each month
- using FH Form 636 (Fort Hood Statistics) available through the DOIM publication stockroom.

Quarterly Statistics will be provided

- to DRM, ATTN: AFZF-RM-M
- by the 10th calendar day following the end of a fiscal quarter.

RCS: AFZF-DRM-02 applies to this information requirement.
