The Climate Change Adaptation Task Force

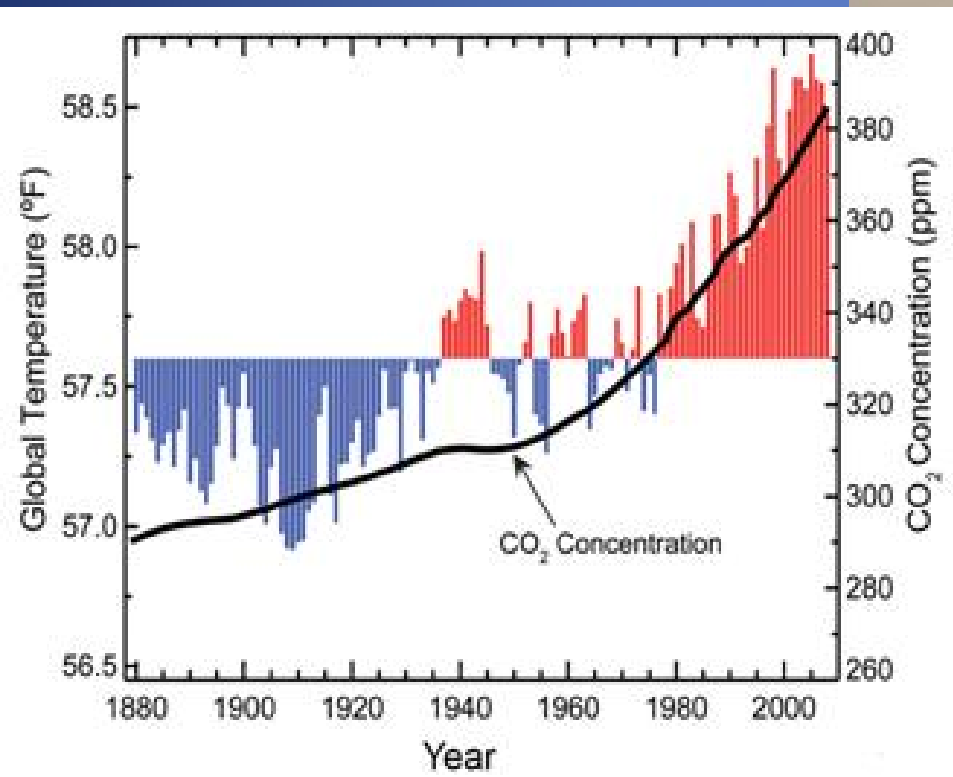
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Role of the Federal Government in Adaptation . . .

- Work with state, local & Tribal governments, NGOs, private sector
- Provide information & tools to decision makers
- Minimize climate impacts to Federal services, operations & assets



Themes from Public Outreach...

- Broader stakeholder engagement
- Improved coordination between all levels of gov'n't
- Sustained funding for state/local adaptation
- Improved accessibility to science
- More Federal guidance and leadership
- Review existing regulations and policies
- Ecosystem based approaches



Guiding Principles

1. Adopt Integrated Approaches
2. Prioritize the Most Vulnerable
3. Use Best-Available Science
4. Build Strong Partnerships
5. Apply Risk-Management Methods and Tools
6. Apply Ecosystem-based Approaches
7. Maximize Mutual Benefits
8. Continuously Evaluate Performance



What does the report recommend?

- 1. Make adaptation a standard part of Agency planning.**
2. Make scientific information about the impacts of climate change available to people in an accessible and localized way.
3. Align Federal efforts to respond to climate impacts that cut across Agency jurisdictions and missions.
