



Gifted News- Ms. Murray

The 3rd graders will be reading *Henry and the Paper* Route by Beverly Cleary. While reading this book, students will be able to address skills in the core curriculum such as cause and effect, retelling and prediction. They will learn new vocabulary and be able to address questions at the higher levels of Bloom's Taxonomy. As an extension to this book, students will complete a project of their choice. In math, 3rd graders will do research on armadillos and determine how long they can hold their breath and walk under water. Students will then record the information in seconds, minutes, and hours. Students will continue by writing multiplication problems for each.

The 4th graders are finishing up *Blue Willow* by Doris Gates and using literature circles with assigned roles.



Examples of literature circle roles include: fact finder, literary luminary, connector, discussion director, scene setter and vocabulary enricher. In math, 4th graders are still participating in the Stock Market Challenge and building problem-solving skills through the use of Superstar Math, creative thinking skills problems and manipulatives.

The 5th graders are finishing up *The Island of the Blue* Dolphins by Scott O'Dell and completing a webquest that goes with the book. In math, 5th graders are still participating in the Stock Market Challenge and building problem-solving skills through the use of Superstar Math, creative thinking skills problems and manipulatives.

Tips for Parents of ESL Students – Parents here are some suggestions for ways you can help your student be more successful at school.

- NETWORK! Meet other families in your school. Other parents and children are often happy to help explain homework and school information.
- If you have any questions about the school, your child's class, homework or other activities, please ask a translator friend to contact the school for you.
- For parent-teacher conferences or other school meetings that might include confidential information, please ask the school to provide an interpreter.
- To improve your own English skills you might like to take adult ESL classes.
- Offer to help in the classroom. This is the best way to keep up on what your child is learning. It's also a great way to meet other parents.
- Ask your children to teach you what they are learning in school in English. This is good practice for them as well as increasing family time.
- Share your culture with your child's classroom. Your child and family are a link to the world. You have many valuable experiences that can enhance the students' understanding of other countries and customs.
- Be a role model for your children. When they see you learning more English they will also want to improve their English and succeed in school.

STUDY SKILLS ARE IMPORTANT

Parents here are some questions for you and your child to answer before setting up a study routine:

Making a Schedule:

- Do you keep a schedule that shows the time you plan to spend each day studying?
- Do you divide your time among the different subjects to be studied?
- Do you spread the study time over at least four days of the week?
- Do you keep up to date in your homework?
- Do you keep a record of the work you need to do in a notebook and check it off when it is completed?

Arranging a place to Study:

- Do you study in a place where you are away from interferences like TV, etc.?
- When you study, do you have all the materials you need right there?
- Do you have enough light to read by?
- Do you work in a cool room?

Answering yes to all of the above questions sets the foundations for developing and maintaining effective study skills that will facilitate student success. Keep up the good work.
