# *Committee on Energy and Commerce*

## *Full Committee*

### **September 2011**

The Committee on Energy and Commerce held a markup on Tuesday, September 20, and Wednesday, September 22, 2011, in 2123 Rayburn House Office Building. The markup agenda is as follows:

- H.R. 2250, the “EPA Regulatory Relief Act of 2011;”
- H.R. 2681, the “Cement Sector Regulatory Relief Act of 2011;” and,
- H.R. 2937, the “Pipeline Infrastructure and Community Protection Act of 2011.

The Full Committee ordered H.R. 2937 reported to the House, as amended, by a record vote of 52 ayes and 0 nays. The following amendment was offered:

- Rep. Upton and Rep. Dingell offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute which was agreed to by voice vote.

The Full Committee ordered H.R. 2681 reported to the House, as amended, by a record vote of 33 ayes and 12 nays. The following amendments were offered:

- Rep. Towns offered an amendment regarding rule of construction which was not agreed to by a vote of 13 ayes and 32 nays.
- Rep. Sullivan offered an amendment regarding the date to finalize certain regulations which was agreed to by a voice vote.

The Full Committee ordered H.R. 2250 reported to the House, as amended, by a record vote of 36 ayes and 14 nays. The following amendments were offered:

- Rep. Griffith offered an amendment regarding the date to finalize certain regulations which was agreed to by a voice vote.
- Rep. Rush offered an amendment regarding a rule of construction which was not agreed to by a vote of 16 ayes and 34 nays.
- Rep. Baldwin offered an amendment regarding the date to finalize certain regulations, a stay of earlier rules, compliance dates, and achievability deadlines which was not agreed to by a vote of 17 ayes and 34 nays.

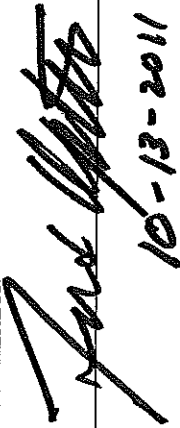
