## **NRC TO HOLD PUBLIC MEETING IN DOTHAN ON NOV. 19 TO DISCUSS EXTENDED FARLEY BREAKER FAILURE INSPECTION RESULTS**

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff will hold a public meeting in Dothan, Ala., on Nov. 19 to discuss the results of an extended Augmented Inspection Team (AIT) review of an electrical breaker failure at the Farley nuclear power plant.

The meeting will begin at 11:00 a.m. (CST) in the County Commissioners Chambers on the third floor of the Houston County Administration Building, 462 N. Oats Street, in Dothan. The meeting is open to observation by the public, and the NRC staff will be available to answer questions from interested observers following the meeting's business portion but before it is adjourned.

On September 4 and 5, two different electrical breakers associated with component cooling water pumps on Unit 1 failed to close during testing. The NRC sent the initial AIT on Sept. 10 following those events. The NRC held a public meeting in Dothan on Sept. 20 to report on the initial AIT inspection findings. However, the initial inspection was extended on October 22 when additional inspectors were dispatched to the plant following an additional failure of a replacement breaker in the plant's Residual Heat Removal System.
