- May-August FY12 awards finalized by the Grants Management Division and recipients notified
- June FY13 Federal Funding Opportunity published
- September Prescott Program Office notifies FY12 nonrecipients
- October 5 FY13 Application Deadline




#### Context for NOAA's FY 2013 Proposal

- The unprecedented size of the federal budget deficit has resulted in pressure to reduce federal spending
- The pressure to reduce budgets is real
- NOAA's FY 2013 budget <u>proposal</u> supports the President's top priority of deficit reduction
- NOAA provides a valuable service to the nation

### NOAA's Approach to FY13: Reflect New Reality of Deficit Reduction

- We cannot continue to do everything at a reduced level
- We must make tough choices that will result in cuts
- We're taking a strategic approach to proposed cuts
- Retain focus on core mission areas; areas where long-term cost savings can be achieved
- Continue to incorporate direction from Congress based on FY 2012 budget
- Continue to balance Science, Service, and Stewardship



## NOAA's Approach to FY13: Criteria for Choices, Changes, Cuts

#### Program Attributes

- Required does this fill a statutory mission?
- Substitutable can other organizations do this?
- Strategic is this central to NOAA's core goals?

#### Potential Impacts

- Impact on Society if we lowered our service
- Impact on NOAA if function is no longer provided



#### **Proposed FY13 Budget Decreases**

- West Coast Proposal: ~\$5.0 M
- Habitat and the Chesapeake Bay Office: ~\$12 M
- Regional Councils and Fisheries Commissions: ~\$5 M
- Prescott Grants: ~\$4 M
- Pacific Coastal Salmon Recovery Fund: ~\$15 M



## De-fund Prescott Grants, Continue to Coordinate Marine Mammal Response

- Proposed reduction would de-fund the Prescott Grant Program
- Not proposing that Congress remove the authorization for Prescott Program from the Marine Mammal Protection Act
- NOAA would rely on private organizations as it coordinates the response to marine mammals in distress; determine disease, injury and potential cause(s) of death; and support emergency response for marine mammals during oil spills, outbreaks of diseases, and unusual mortality events
- NOAA recognizes that during this transition our network partners may not be able to respond to some stranding events. The ability to monitor marine mammal health trends, collect scientific data, and perform analysis may also be diminished.

#### **FY13 Federal Budget Process**

- May 2011 NOAA proposal to Department of Commerce
- September 2011 Commerce proposal to Office of Management and Budget
- February 13, 2012 -- President's FY13 budget request goes to Congress
- Spring/Summer Congressional Appropriations Committees work on Appropriation
   House Appropriations Committee Vote TBD
- Full House Vote TBD
- Senate Committee Vote TBD
- Full Senate Vote TBD
- Conference Committee Vote TBD
- Final Congressional Approval, and FY13 Enacted bill sent to the President
- President signs the Appropriation TBD
