Lumber and Wood

Trade and Tariffs

Chapter 44 of the Harmonized Tariff System defines the lumber and wood sector. Lumber and wood accounted for approximately 1 percent of total U.S. non-textile industrial exports to Bahrain¹ in 2002. Top U.S. exports in this sector were lumber from oak, sawn and other non-coniferous woods. Bahrain applies a uniform tariff of five percent on lumber and wood products.

Bahrain did not export goods from this sector to the United States in 2002.² The United States, however, applies tariffs of 0 to 10.7 percent to these products, with an average of 2 percent.

Tariff Elimination

Both sides will eliminate duties on imports of lumber and wood products from the other Party immediately upon implementation of the Agreement.
