# Recovery Act Section 1512(c) Reporting

- [FederalReporting.gov](http://FederalReporting.gov) was created exclusively for Recovery Act Section 1512(c) reporting.
- Reporting on Project Activities is cumulative (Report activity from the Project Start Date to the end of the reporting period.)
  - Guidance on the Jobs data elements will be forthcoming.
- DOJ Recovery Act grant recipients with awards of \$25,000 or more are required to submit Section 1512(c) reports on a quarterly basis.
- **NEW GUIDANCE:** Recipients are required by the Recovery Act to report from the 1<sup>st</sup> to the 10<sup>th</sup>; FederalReporting.gov will be available for reporting from the 1<sup>st</sup> to the 15<sup>th</sup>.

## Recipient Reporting

The Recovery Act clearly states, "every taxpayer dollar spent on our economic recovery must be subject to unprecedented levels of transparency and accountability." In accordance with this objective, Section 1512(c) of the Recovery Act established a quarterly reporting requirement that applies to recipients of the Office of Justice Programs (OJP), the Office of Community Oriented Policing (COPS Office), and the Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) Recovery Act awards. The first quarterly report under Section 1512 (c) is due on **October 10, 2009**. Section 1512 (c) reporting must be submitted through <https://www.FederalReporting.gov>. The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) encourages all prime recipients and delegated subrecipients to register as soon as possible. Registration may take up to 8 business days to complete. To register, a recipient must have a DUNS number and be registered in the Central Contractor Registration.

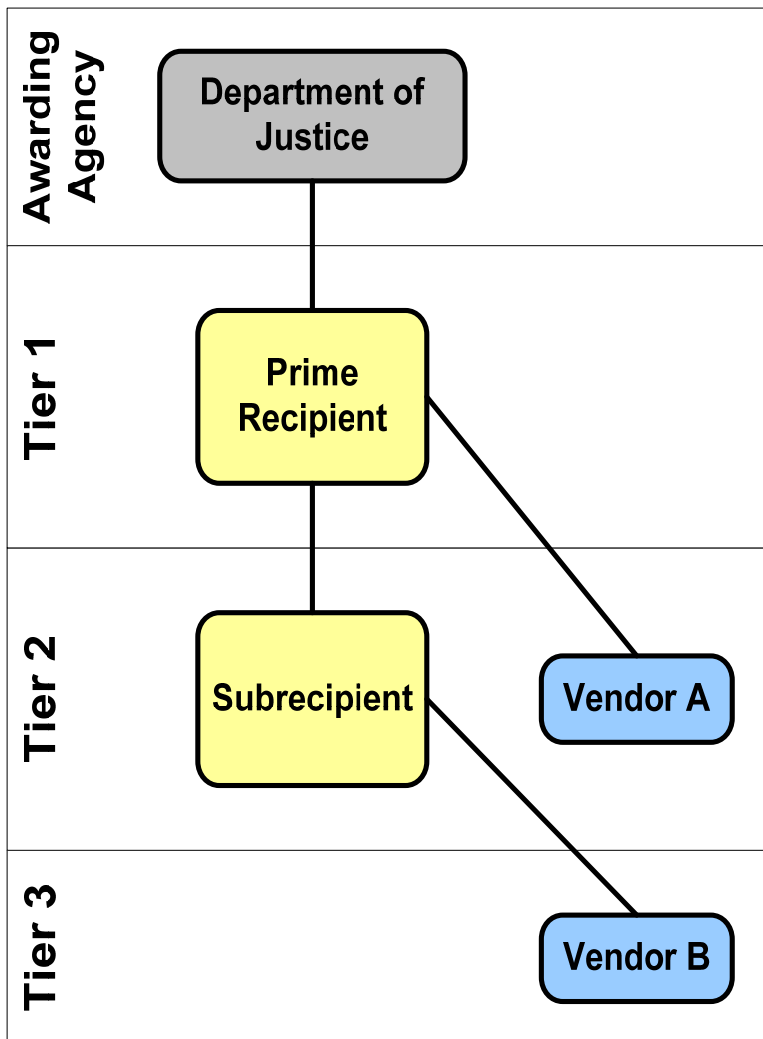

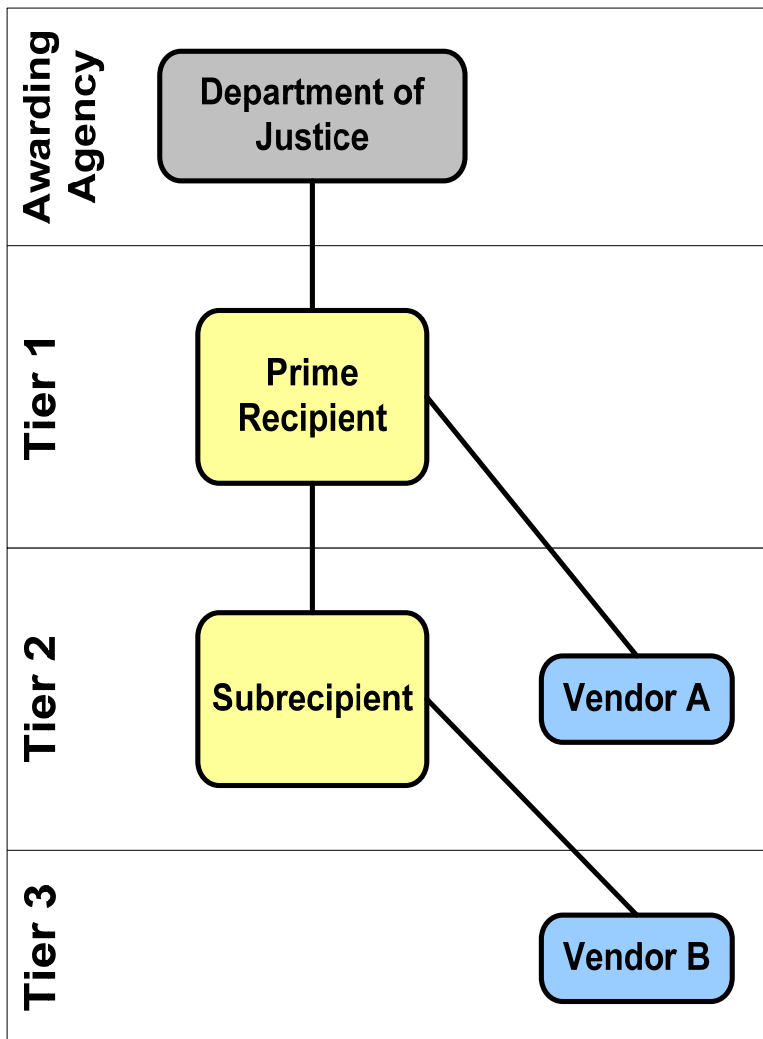

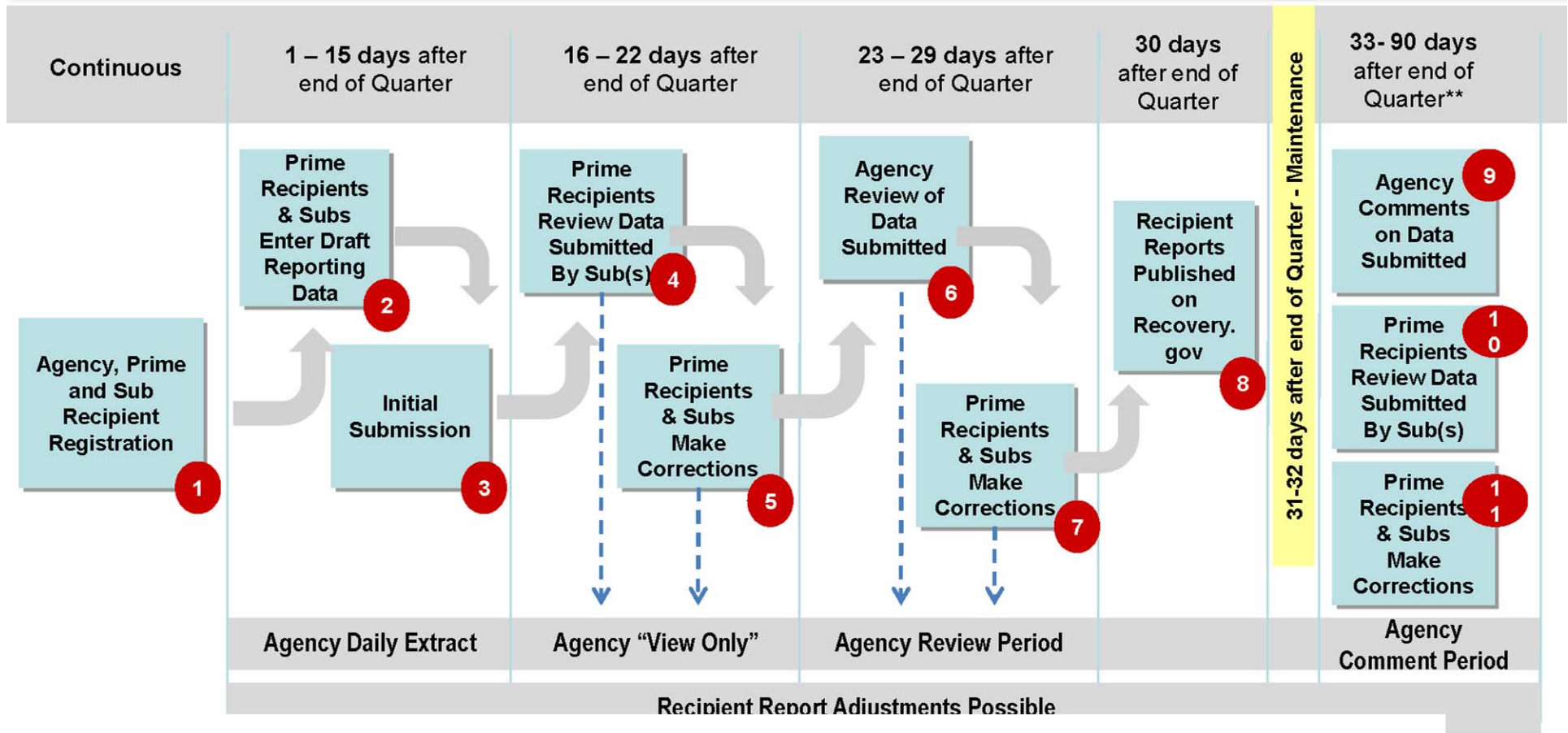

**NEW GUIDANCE:** Recipients are required by the Recovery Act to report from the 1<sup>st</sup> to the 10<sup>th</sup>; FederalReporting.gov will be available for reporting from the 1<sup>st</sup> to the 15<sup>th</sup>.



There will be no late submission during Days 00-05

# Proposed Functionality Update

1. The FRPIN will now be delivered to your FederalReproting.gov user inbox.
2. When submitting your January report, users will have the option to “Copy Forward” the October data and update individual data fields.

**NEW ENHANCEMENTS: Award and DUNS numbers can now be corrected at any time during the review and editing process.**

3. Data can be edited post-submission, beginning February 1, 2009.
4. An edit check for certain fields, such as the congressional district, award amount, and job count.  
*Alert Message: Data questionable, but report can still be submitted.*  
*Error Message: Data incorrect, must be corrected to submit report.*



# Troubleshooting: Award Number

If your October report had an incorrect Award Number

**NEW ENHANCEMENTS:** Award and DUNS numbers can now be corrected at any time during the review and editing process.

- The correct DOJ award format is **2009-XX-XX-XXXX**.

- Create/Update **CCR registration** for legal recipient. (Verify point of contact.)
- Verify/Update **GMS profile**. (GAN required to change DUNS.)
- Verify **FederalReporting.gov registration**. May need to re-register using correct DUNS.



# Troubleshooting: DUNS Number

If your October report had an incorrect DUNS number

- DOJ validates the DUNS number with the DUNS number in GMS.
  - If the DUNS number in GMS is incorrect, please submit a Grant Adjustment Notice in OJP’s Grants Management System to update your GMS profile.
  - If the DUNS number in GMS is correct and the DUNS number in the Section 1512 (c) report is incorrect, please submit a new report in [FederalReporting.gov](http://FederalReporting.gov).
    - Do NOT “Copy Forward” when submitting the January Report.





## Troubleshooting: Wrong Agency

If a different Federal agency contacts you and states that your report was sent to the wrong agency, **change the Funding and/or Awarding Agency Code in the submitted Section 1512 (c) report.**

Prime recipients with awards **less than \$25,000** are **NOT** required to report.

## Do I Have to Report?

Recipients must report if their award date falls before the end of the reporting period (i.e., December, 31 2009)



# Do I Have to Report?

**Recipient U has spent all of their funds and plans to closeout their award by the end of January. Do they have to submit a 1512 report?**



## Do I Have to Report?

**Recipient U has spent all of their funds and plans to closeout their award by the end of January. Do they have to submit a 1512 report?**

**YES**

Recipients must report as long as their award is active. A final 1512(c) report may be submitted after a closeout package has been submitted and approved in GMS or CMS.





# October Reports Not Submitted

If a recipient did not report in October, the January report must include on activities from your project period to the end of the quarter (December 31, 2009).



## Failure to Submit a Section 1512 (c) Report

- Recipients who fail to submit a Section 1512 (c) report as required by the terms of their award are considered to be non-compliant. Non-compliant recipients, including those who are persistently late or negligent in their reporting obligations, are subject to Federal action, up to and including the termination of Federal funding or the ability to receive Federal funds in the future.
- Recipients who do not submit reports will be posted on the Recovery.gov website.



## Section 1512(c) Reporting

**All DOJ Recovery Act funding recipients \$25,000 or more are required to report under Section 1512(c) of the Recovery Act.**

- Prime Recipients (entities that receive awards directly from DOJ)
- Subrecipients who have been delegated reporting responsibilities by their prime recipient.
- Prime recipients with awards **less than \$25,000** are **NOT** required to report.



## How Do I Need to Prepare for Reporting?

- **Verify CCR, GMS and FederalReporting.gov registration data.**
  - Points of Contact
  - DUNS Numbers
- **Coordinate subrecipient data collection and/or delegation.**
- **Document and communicate internal procedures.**
- **Establish separate tracking & accounting mechanisms.**
- **Verify compliance with all Recovery Act Requirements/Special Conditions**



# Data Quality Checks

## Verify control information

- Number of submissions does not exceed number of unique subrecipients
- Amount of subawards reported does not exceed total of prime award made

## Check for material omissions

- Data are not reported (e.g., percent of project completed, estimated number of jobs)

## Check for reporting errors

- Subrecipient reports 100% project completion, but has received minimal funding
- Subrecipient reports expenditures in excess of total amount of subaward
- Reported values show a decrease from a prior reporting period

## Look for outliers

- Expended amounts reported by subrecipients are significantly over or under anticipated amounts
- Number of jobs created falls well outside the range of the number of jobs created for awards of similar value and purpose

## Verify Correct Identifying Data

- Correct DOJ award number
- Correct DUNS number

**NEW ENHANCEMENT: Award and DUNS numbers can now be corrected at any time during the review and editing process.**



# **Additional Recovery Act Requirements**



## Infrastructure

DOJ defines infrastructure as projects requiring “bricks & mortar.” That is, projects resulting in, or directly and substantially affecting, a tangible physical structure or other similar construction, repair, or major renovation projects.

### **Infrastructure examples include:**

- building or renovating a correctional facility,
- building a road,
- modifying the exterior of a building,
- modifying the purpose of a building through major renovation, and
- projects that require review under applicable environmental laws (e.g., NEPA).



## Buy American

Section 1605 of the Recovery Act provides use of American iron, steel, and manufactured goods:

*“None of the funds appropriated or otherwise made available by this Act may be used for a **project for the construction, alteration, maintenance, or repair of a public building or public work** unless all of the iron, steel, and manufactured goods used in the project are produced in the United States.”*

- Public work is defined in 2 CFR 176.140.
- DOJ may grant a waiver of the Buy American requirement if use of American materials would be inconsistent with public interest, the goods are not available, and/or the cost is unreasonable.

*Please contact your grant manager with any questions or concerns.*





## NEPA

Section 1609 of the Recovery Act states that:

- The National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) protects public health, safety, and environmental quality by ensuring the transparency, accountability, and public involvement in federal actions and in the use of public funds;
- The NEPA helps to provide an orderly process for considering federal action and funding decisions, and prevents litigation and delay that would otherwise be inevitable and existed prior to the establishment of the NEPA.

Section 1609 of the Recovery Act states that:

- Adequate resources within this bill must be devoted to ensuring that applicable environmental reviews under the NEPA are completed on an expeditious basis, and that the shortest existing applicable process under NEPA shall be utilized.



## Davis-Bacon Wage Rate

- ARRA § 1606
- Recipients of assistance under ARRA must require contractors and subcontractors to pay at least the prevailing wage (as determined under the Davis-Bacon Act) to laborers and mechanics on ARRA-assisted “construction projects” (including some minor renovations).



## Davis-Bacon Wage Rate

- Apply to any individual project that involves over \$2000 of construction, alteration, or repair, including painting or decorating, as well as installation of items fabricated off-site.
- If you are not sure if your project includes activities that would subject it to the requirements, please contact your grant manager.



## Davis-Bacon Wage Rate

- Any covered contract must include contract clauses referenced in ARRA award document (29 CFR 5.5(a)).
- Clauses require contractors and subcontractors to pay laborers and mechanics prevailing wage rates, on a weekly basis, and submit records to the ARRA award recipient.
- DOJ component may require regular submission of those records.



## Davis-Bacon Wage Rate

- The Department of Labor is responsible for making determinations regarding what wages are prevailing for certain classes of mechanics and laborers that are employed on projects similar to the contract work in the locality of the contract work.
- General wage determinations may be found at [www.wdol.gov](http://www.wdol.gov).
- If there is no general wage determination that matches your project, please contact your grant manager as soon as possible.



## Limit on Funds

Section 1604 of the Recovery Act states:

*None of the funds appropriated or otherwise made available in this Act may be used by any State or local government, or any private entity, for any casino or other gambling establishment, aquarium, zoo, golf course, or swimming pool.*



## Limit on Funds

**A mentoring program plans to take a group of youths to spend the day at a community pool. The program may pay for transportation to and from the pool using Recovery Act funds, but may not pay any pool entrance fees.**

**A state has been awarded Recovery Act funds through the Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program, and wants to use a portion of the funds to install surveillance cameras at a local golf course to discourage and prevent vandalism. The equipment would aid in providing security for the golf course, and as such, is prohibited under the Recovery Act.**



## Limit on Funds

A Recovery Act tribal recipient organizes and a conference with Recovery Act funds. The conference is held at a hotel located within the tribal gambling premises. Recovery Act funds can be used to pay for conference services at a hotel with a casino, golf course, and/or swimming pool, but Recovery Act funds may not be used to gamble or purchase admission tickets to enter casino.





## Reporting Grant Fraud and Abuse

**Each prime recipient or subrecipient awarded funds made available under the Recovery Act is to promptly refer to an appropriate inspector general any credible evidence that a principal, employee, agent, contractor, subgrantee, subcontractor, or other person has submitted a false claim under the False Claims Act or has committed a criminal or civil violation of laws pertaining to fraud, conflict of interest, bribery, gratuity, or similar misconduct involving Recovery Act funds.**

The second quarterly report is to be submitted directly to the COPS Office through the Account Access portion of the COPS Office website at [www.cops.usdoj.gov](http://www.cops.usdoj.gov) and is due 30 days after the end of the calendar quarter.
