SEC COMMISSIONER LAURA UNGER TO ADDRESS Y2K CONTINGENCY PLANNING AND RISK MITIGATION AT SIA CONFERENCE

Commissioner Laura S. Unger will speak at the Security Industry Association's Y2K Update Conference on June 23, 1999. The conference will take place at the Marriott Marquis in New York City.

Commissioner Unger's remarks will focus on what the securities industry can expect to occur over the next six months leading up to the transition weekend. In particular, she will discuss the Commission's proposed Year 2000 operational capability rules, contingency planning, and data collection by the Commission, the exchanges, and the NASD.

Other speakers will include Gerald Corrigan, managing director of Goldman Sachs and chairman of the Contingency Planning Policy Committee; Janet Abrams, executive director of the President's Council on Year 2000 Conversion; and Dr. Edward E. Yardini, chief economist and managing director of Deutsche Morgan Grenfell.

Representatives of the financial markets and utilities will be available to answer questions at breakout sessions throughout the afternoon. In addition, attendees can participate in workshops on: "Municipality Infrastructure Readiness," "An International Update," "Internal Firm Planning: Contingency and Event Management Planning," and "Communication and Coordination Centers/Industry Event Management."

ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

COMMISSION ADJUSTS DISGORGEMENT OWED BY DEAN WITTER REYNOLDS, INC. IN NASDAQ INVESTIGATION

On June 18, the Commission entered an order adjusting from \$2311 to \$625 the disgorgement to be paid by Dean Witter Reynolds, Inc. in connection with the settlement of the Nasdaq Investigation. For further information, see Rel. 34-40905 (Jan. 11, 1999). (Rel. 34-41537; File No. 3-9803)

CEASE AND DESIST PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST GARY PIERCE AND C.S.I AG. FOR FRAUDULENT INTERNET OFFERING

On May 11, the Commission issued an order instituting public cease and desist proceedings pursuant to Section 8A of the Securities Act of 1933 against Gary J. Pierce, of Studio City, California, and C.S.I. Ag., a Turks & Caicos company.

In the order, the Division of Enforcement (Division) alleges that from July 1997 to February 1999, Pierce and CSI solicited investments in a \$500 million unregistered bond offering for the Government of Free Vietnam, a political association in Garden Grove, California, via its Internet website and its newspaper. The Division further alleges that the promotional materials promised potential investors who made an initial \$10,000 minimum investment a 5.5% annual return, plus double their original investment at the end of five years, resulting in an overall average annual return of at least 19.6%. According to the Division, Pierce and CSI represented that the bond offering was collateralized by \$500 million of CSI's gold reserves in Chile, the total value of which was in excess of \$20 billion, when, in fact, they had no reasonable basis for assigning any value to any such gold reserves, and they knew or were reckless in not knowing that the extraction of any existing gold would take years and millions of dollars. The Division further alleges that Pierce and CSI knowingly or recklessly failed to disclose the fact that 70% of the money invested would be used for fees and other activities that would generate no revenue, and that only 30% would be invested in an unspecified "yield rich trading program," which would have to generate an average annual rate of return on those funds in excess of 56% for five years to pay investors the rates of return promised. The Division alleges that Pierce and CSI violated Sections 5(c), 17(a)(1) and 17(a)(3) of the Securities Act.

A public hearing will be scheduled to determine whether the allegations against CSI and Pierce are true and, if so, whether a cease and desist order should be entered pursuant to Section 8A of the Securities Act. (Rel. IA-7676; File No. 3-9892)

ADMINISTRATIVE AND CEASE AND DESIST PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST STERN FISHER EDWARDS, INC. AND EARL FISHER

On June 18, the Commission entered an Order Instituting Public Administrative and Cease And Desist Proceedings, Making Findings and Imposing Sanctions Pursuant to Sections 203(e), 203(f) and 203(k) of

the Investment Advisers Act (Order) against Stern Fisher Edwards, Inc. (Stern Fisher) and Earl W. Fisher (Fisher). Stern Fisher, a registered investment adviser, and Fisher consented to the entry of the Order without admitting or denying its findings. The Order finds that Fisher, who was the President of Stern Fisher from 1981 to 1998, willfully aided and abetted and caused Stern Fisher to engage in transactions on behalf of its investment advisor clients in violation of Section 206(3) of the Investment Advisers Act (Advisers Act). Specifically, from January 1995 through April 1998, Stern Fisher engaged in approximately 960 riskless principal transactions in its advisory clients' accounts without disclosing to such clients in writing before the completion of such transactions the capacity in which Stern Fisher was acting and obtaining the consent of the clients to such transactions. The Order requires Stern Fisher and Fisher to cease and desist from committing or causing any violation and any future violations of Section 206(3) of the Advisers Act, and imposes a civil penalty on Stern Fisher and Fisher of \$10,000 and \$5,000 respectively. BETTY RUBIN PREVENTED FROM DISCHARGING DISGORGEMENT JUDGMENT

On June 1, the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Central District of California entered a judgment against Betty Ann Rubin, a brokerage firm president. The Court's judgment prevents Rubin from discharging the \$346,410.92 disgorgement judgment obtained in SEC v. KS Resources, et al., Case No. 95-8608 WDK, AJWx, C.D. California.

Rubin, through her broker-dealer Lazar Frederick & Company, fraudulently offered and sold KS Resources oil and gas limited partnerships from May 1993 through December 1995 through general solicitation. Rubin's sales agents misrepresented that previous partnerships had paid investors between 10% to 12% annually from partnership oil and gas revenue when in fact investor funds paid most of the investor returns. Further, Rubin through Lazar, accepted \$2.9 million in "nuisance fees" from the general partner for fraudulently selling these securities. The fraudulent Ponzi-like scheme raised more than \$35,534,000 from over 1,500 investors, many of whom were elderly. PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The American Stock Exchange filed a proposed rule change (SR-Amex-99-08) to implement its New Equity Market Structure, which includes the development of a new electronic order book for equities and incorporates automatic execution for electronically delivered

orders and transparency of the book up to two minimum trading increments away from the Amex bid and offer. The Amex also proposes to eliminate certain specialist stabilization requirements. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of June 21. (Rel. 34-41527)
